The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that they have made an Order under section 203 of the Customs and Excise Act, 1952, viz.:—

The Hydrocarbon Oil Duties (Drawback) (No. 1) Order, 1958, which provides for the allowance of drawback of customs or excise duty paid in respect of hydrocarbon oil used as a solvent in the manufacture of soya bean oil and ground nut oil. The drawback applies when the articles are exported, or shipped or deposited in warehouse for use as stores, on or after 9th July, 1958. The quantities of oil in respect of which drawback is allowable are to be determined in accordance with the provisions of the Schedule.

The Order comes into operation on the 9th July, 1958, and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1958, (No. 11107).
