THE COUNTY OF MONMOUTH (WHITE LION SQUARE & BANK STREET, CHEPSTOW) (PROHIBITION OF WAITING) ORDER, 1958.

THE Monmouthshire County Council propose to make an Order under the Road Traffic Act, 1930, as amended, the effect of which will be that:—

No person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to wait between the hours of 8 a.m. and 8 p.m. in White Lion Square and Bank Street, Chepstow, from White Lion Square to Hocker Hill Street.

Exceptions will be provided in the Order to enable a vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for a person to board or alight from the vehicle, to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle, or to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, and the maintenance of the road or the services therein.
