This Order amends the Composite Goods Order, 1957, by reducing the average rates of customs duty to be charged on fruit juices of the descriptions which it specifies, in respect of any sugar contained in them as an ingredient.

The Order comes into operation on 15th September 1958 and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1958, No. 1448.

HOMICIDE ACT, 1957

An Inquisition indented, taken for our Sovereign Lady the Queen, at Her Majesty's Prison, Durham, pursuant to the directions of "The Capital Punishment Amendment Act, 1868", on the third day of September, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifty eight, before William Carr Coroner of our said Lady the Queen for the said County of Durham on view of the body of Frank Stokes now here lying dead at Her Majesty's Prison, at Durham aforesaid within the Jurisdiction of the said Coroner, upon the oaths of the undersigned Jurors, good and lawful men of the said County, who being now here duly chosen, sworn, and charged to enquire, for our said Lady the Queen, when, where, and in what manner, the said Frank Stokes came to his death, say upon their oaths that the said Frank Stokes was a Prisoner in the said Prison, indicted and convicted for the murder of Linda Violet Ash and sentenced to death for the said offence, after the passing of the said Statute. And that judgment of death was duly executed and carried into effect upon the said offender, for the said offence, on the day and year aforesaid, within the walls of the said Prison in which the said offender was confined at the time of execution. And the Jurors aforesaid, upon their oaths aforesaid, do further say that this Inquest is now here held, on view of the body of the said offender, by the Coroner of the Jurisdiction to which the said Prison belongs, within twenty-four hours after the execution; and that the body of the said Frank Stokes now here lying dead, is the identical body of the said offender, who was so convicted and executed for the offence aforesaid. And that the said offender, at the time of his death was a male person, of the age of forty-five years, and an hotel porter.

KEY INDUSTRY DUTY

The Treasury have made an Order under sections 10 (5) and 12 (2) of the Finance Act, 1926, terminating the temporary exemption from Key Industry Duty of imports of dimethylamine.

Hartismere Rural District (Poppys Farm, Weybread Footpath) Extinguishment Order, 1958

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Housing and Local Government in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by section 44 of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, after consultation with the Hartismere Rural District Council proposes to make an Order for the extinguishment of a footpath between Weybread Street and Mill Lane, Weybread in the County of Suffolk.

The draft Order relates to land situate at Poppys Farm, Weybread.

The effect of the Order will be to extinguish the public right of way leading from a point on the north side of Weybread Street and running for a distance of 1,470 feet in a generally northerly direction along the western hedges of O.S. Nos. 212 and 216 and then from a point about 190 feet from Poppys Farm across O.S. No. 277 to a point on the south side of Mill Lane.
