The Ashton-under-Lyne Traffic Regulation Order No. 1, 1958

CHIPPING NORTON RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL

The Chipping Norton Rural District Council (Charlbury) Extinguishment Order, 1957

Notice is hereby given that on the 9th day of September 1958, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed with modifications the above Order.

The effect of the Order is to extinguish at the expiration of twenty-one days from the date of confirmation of this Order the public right of way of a width of approximately 8 feet and a length of approximately 460 feet in the parish of Charlbury over the footpath leading from Sturt Road to join the Estate road serving the Hughes Close and Sturt Close Housing Estates between the points marked "A"—"X" as shown coloured brown on the map annexed to the Order.

The Order becomes operative as from the 19th day of September 1958, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order he may, within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice make application to the High Court.

Chichester Rural District Council Hunston Canal Footpath Diversion Order, 1958

Notice is hereby given that the above Order was made on the 7th day of May 1958, and is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

The Order relates to land situate in the Parish of Hunston.

The effect of the Order will be to divert the public footpath leading westwards from the Chichester-Selsey Road (B.2145) at a point 65 feet west of the carriageway and leading westwards across Poyntz Bridge to the path on the west bank of the Chichester Canal at Hunston to a line commencing at the eastern end of the length of footpath proposed to be stopped up and running westwards immediately north of Poyntz Bridge crossing the Canal by a footbridge, having a width of 3 feet, to the path on the west bank of the Canal.
