Treasury Chambers, London S.W.1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that they have made an Order under sections 3 and 19 of the Import Duties Act, 1932, and section 1 of the Import Duties (Emergency Provisions) Act, 1939, viz.:

The Additional Import Duties (No. 5) Order, 1958.

Certain iron and steel goods were temporarily exempted from duty under the Import Duties Act, 1932, for a period ending on 18th September 1958. This Order provides that, on their ceasing to be exempt, they shall in all cases become liable to duty at the appropriate rate under the tariff for iron and steel goods introduced by the Additional Import Duties (No. 3) Order, 1958.

The Order came into operation on 19th September 1958, and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1958, No. 1564.
