

BRIDGE-BLEAN RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL

The Rural District Council of Bridge-Blean (Footpath No. 10, Sturry) Diversion Order, 1958

Notice is hereby given that on the 12th day of September 1958, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed the above-mentioned Order.

The effect of the Order is to divert the public right-of-way running from a point on Route C.247 west of Sweechgate Cottages, Broad Oak, Sturry, for a distance of approximately 140 feet in a northerly and north-easterly direction, to a new line running from a point on Route C.247 west of the said Cottages in a north-easterly and northerly direction for a distance of approximately 106 feet and an easterly direction for approximately 69 feet. The old right-of-way is to be closed on the 29th November 1958.

A certified copy of the Order and of the map contained in the Order as confirmed by the Minister has been deposited at the offices of the Bridge-Blean Rural District Council, 41 Old Dover Road, Canterbury, and will be open for inspection free of charge between the hours of 9 a.m. and 1 p.m. and 2.15 p.m. and 5 p.m. from Monday to Friday inclusive, and 9 a.m. to 12 noon on Saturdays.

The Order becomes operative as from the 26th day of September 1958, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order, he may, within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice, make application to the High Court.
