Distinguished Service Order

Lieutenant-Colonel Arthur William Neville Langston VICKERS, O.B.E. (62638), 2nd King Edward VII's Own Gurkha Rifles. (The Sirmoor Rifles) (now Emp. List 1.)

During his period of command Lieutenant-Colonel VICKERS has added to the renown and fighting traditions of his regiment and proved himself to be a fearless, skilful and determined leader in the field. Inspired by his leadership his men achieved a large number of successes, in jungle operations, against a wary, treacherous and dangerous enemy. Within a year of his assumption of command, in 1956, he completely disrupted the communist terrorists' organisation in the Bahu area
