The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that they have made an Order under sections 1 and 19 of the Import Duties Act, 1932, section 10 of the Finance Act, 1934, section 7 of the Finance Act, 1936 and section 1 of the Import Duties (Emergency Provisions) Act, 1939, viz.

The Import Duties (Exemptions) (No. 21) Order, 1958, which continues until 31st December 1958, the existing exemption from duty under the Im-port Duties Act, 1932, of certain uncovered rubber thread of circular cross-sections, and extends the scope of the exemption to include certain un-covered rubber thread of oval, square or rectangular cross-section.

The Order comes into operation on the 12th November 1958, and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1958, No. 1825.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 14th November 1958, at 1 p.m., for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Act, 1939, to the amount of £60,000,000 for Bills due 63 days after date and to the amount of £210,000,000 for Bills due 91 days after date. 2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5.000, £10,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 17th November 1958, to Saturday, the 22nd November 1958, inclusive.
3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of Eveloped

of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount which will be given, for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different currencies and for Bills of different dates.
