The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that they have made an Order under Section 9 of the Finance Act, 1932, and Section 1 of the Import Duties (Emergency Provisions) Act, 1939, viz.:

The Import Duties (Drawback) (No. 13) Order, 1958, which reduces from £3 15s. 0d. to £3 per ton the rate of drawback of Customs duty on unrefined wood tar used in the manufacture of certain refined wood tar, but increases from 1-1/12 tons to 1-1/11 tons per ton of the exported refined wood tar the quantity of unrefined wood tar in respect of which drawback is allowable.

The Order comes into operation on the 18th November 1958, and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1958, No. 1869.
