"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, and the Diocesan Stipends Funds Measure, 1953, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the followed the Diocesan Superios Funds Measure, 1933, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Percy, Bishop of Norwich (in witness whereof he has signed this Scheme), for effecting the union of the benefice of Grimston and the benefice of Congham, both situate in the diocese of Norwich.

- "1. Union of Benefices. The benefice of Grimston and the benefice of Congham shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Grimston with Congham' but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.
- "2. Taking effect of union. Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend Eric Leslie Fuller if he is then incumbent of the said benefice of Grimston shall, with his consent (testified by his signature hereto), be the first incumbent of the united benefice.
- "3. Parsonage House. Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Grimston shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice.
- "4. Patronage. After the union has taken effect the right of presentation to the united benefice shall be exercised by the patrons of the two benefices alternately, the patron of the benefice of Congham having the first presentation to the united benefice to be made after the union.

"5. Diversion of Endowment Income
"(1) Subject as hereinafter provided, any surplus, calculated by us for the twelve months ending on the slst March in each year, of the endowment income (calculated in accordance with the Schedule hereto) of the united benefice over and above an annual sum of £750 shall, with effect from the date upon which

the union shall take effect, be paid to and be held by us, for the benefit of the diocesan stipends fund of the said diocese. Provided that if any additional capital endowment shall accrue to or be acquired by the united benefice (not being capital endowment derived from the sale of any property of the united benefice) after the date upon which the union shall the effect than the income from such subsequently take effect then the income from such subsequently acquired capital endowment shall not be taken into account for the purpose of calculating such surplus as aforesaid.

"(2) The said endowment income and the said surplus and the said annual sum of £750 shall be deemed to accrue from day to day and shall when we deem that circumstances so require be apportion-

able accordingly.

"(3) Any moneys due to us from the incumbent of the united benefice, or, during any vacancy in the united benefice, from the sequestrators thereof, as the case may be (herinafter called 'the incumbent or sequestrators') upon the calculation of the said surplus shall be paid by the incumbent or sequestrators plus shall be paid by the incumbent or sequestrators to us not later than the 30th June in each year and shall be recoverable as a debt due to us.

"(4) For the purpose of ascertaining the amounts

of the said endowment income and of the said surplus, we shall have power to require production by the incumbent or sequestrators of accounts and other documents in relation thereto, and the said accounts for the twelve months to 31st March in each year (or where applicable for a part of the year ending on (or where applicable for a part of the year ending on that date) shall be rendered annually to us within six weeks of that date in such form as we shall prescribe; and in the event of failure by the incumbent or sequestrators to produce such accounts or documents we shall have all legal remedies for enforcing production thereof.

"For the purpose of this Scheme and subject to the proviso contained in clause 5 (1) thereof the endowment income of the united benefice shall, without prejudice to the power of decision vested in us by virtue of section 18 of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, if any question shall arise, be computed in accordance with our Central Register of Benefice Income, that is to say, by including:

"(1) all gross secured income payable by us and any other person or body,

"and (2) all gross income received from ground rents, chief rents or other fixed charges, other glebe rents and letting of the patronage house or a for-mally divided portion thereof,

"and by deducting therefrom:

"(1) the rates payable on the parsonage house it occupied by the incumbent,

"(2) the rent and rates payable on any house occupied by the incumbent other than the parsonage

occupied by the incumbent other than the parsonage house,

"(3) the annual assessment charged upon the incumbent under the Ecclesiastical Dilapidations Measures, 1923 to 1951, in respect of the benefice,

"(4) the rates payable on the glebe,

"(5) the cost of collecting glebe rents,

"(6) any tithe annuity, rentcharge or fee farm rent charged upon the glebe,

"(7) any other outgoings in respect of the glebe,

"(8) any charge upon the benefice income in favour of another benefice or any lay person,

"(9) any payment to a curate or lay worker out

"(9) any payment to a curate or lay worker out of the benefice income,

(10) the annual payments in respect of capital interest in respect of any mortgage of the benefice income,

"(11) any part of the benefice income diverted to the diocesan stipends fund pursuant to an Order under section 12 of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949."

of Saint Aidan, Billingham.

"The district (or parish) shall be in the Archdeaconry of Auckland and in the rural deanery

 (1) That part of the benefice of Brimpton with Wasing which remains after the severence therefrom of the area referred to in Clause 2 (1) of this Scheme, namely that part which coincides with the area of the parish of Wasing after the alteration of boundaries as aforesaid, and the benefice of Aldermaston shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Aldermaston with Wasing,' but the parishes of Aldermaston and Wasing shall continue in all respects distinct. all respects distinct.
- (2) Parsonage House. After the union has taken effect and upon the provision at Aldermaston of a house approved by us as suitable to be the

- residence house of the incumbent of the united benefice, such house as aforesaid shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice.
- "(3) Patronage. After the union has taken effect the right of presentation to the united benefice shall be exercised alternately by the patrons of the benefice of Aldermaston and by that one of the alternate patrons of the benefice of Brimpton with Wasing (or his successor in title) who was patron of the former benefice of Wasing immediately prior to its union with the former immediately prior to its union with the former benefice of Brimpton, the last mentioned patron having the first presentation to the united benefice to be made after the union.

Upon the taking effect of the unions hereinbefore recommended and proposed the endowments and property belonging to the benefice of Brimpton with Wasing shall be divided the benefice of Brimpton with Wasing shall be divided and distributed as follows, that is to say: the endowments and property specified in the Second Schedule hereto shall be assigned and annexed to the united benefice of Aldermaston with Wasing and all other the endowments and property (with the exception of the parsonage house) belonging to the said benefice of Brimpton with Wasing shall be assigned and annexed to the united benefice of Midgham with Brimpton Brimpton.

"All those parts (coloured pink on the map annexed hereto) of the parish of Brimpton which lie to the east and southeast of a line partly imaginary and partly following an existing parochial boundary commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parishes of Brimpton and Woodlands in the middle of the road leading from Kingsclere to Shalford Bridge and continuing thence northeastwards along the middle of the last mentioned road to a point opposite the southeastern end of the southwestern boundary of close numbered 106 on the map, north-westwards to and along the last mentioned boundary to its end, northeastwards along the northwestern boundary and generally southeastwards along the mortheastern boundary of the last mentioned close to its end and in a straight line in continuation thereof to the middle of the beforementioned road, and con-tinuing thence generally nontheastwards and nonth-wards along the middle of the beforementioned road to a point opposite the southeastern end of the northeastern boundary of close numbered 71, northwest-wards to and along the last mentioned boundary to its end and in a straight line in continuation thereof to the southeastern boundary of close numbered 71a, northeastwards along the last mentioned boundary to its end, generally northwards along the western boundaries of closes numbered 75 and 74, eastwards along the monthern boundaries of closes numbered 74 and 76 and in a straight line in continuation thereof to the boundary which divides the parishes of Brimpton and Wasing.
