Notice is hereby given that the Lord Mayor, Aldermen and Citizens of the City of Manchester the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Glossop and the Rural District Council of Chapel-en-le-Frith are about to apply to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for an Order under section 9 of the Water Act, 1945.

Copies of a draft of the intended Order and of an ordnance map showing the boundaries of the existing limits of supply of the Manchester Corporation and of the areas proposed to be added thereto have been deposited at the Parliamentary Office, Town Clerk's Department, Town Hall, Manchester, at the Town Clerk's Office, Municipal Buildings, Glossop and at the office of the Clerk of the Council, Chapel-en-le-Frith Rural District Council, Council Offices, Hayfield Road, Chapel-en-le-Frith, and may be inspected by any person free of charge at all reasonable hours.

A notice explaining the effect of the proposed Order

has been or will be published in the *Manchester Guardian*, the *High Peake Reporter* and the *Glossop Chronicle* of the 5th and 12th December 1958.

## SHIPLEY URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL

## The Shipley No. 1 (Saltaire) Smoke Control Order, 1958

1. Notice is hereby given that the Shipley Urban District Council in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 11 of the above-mentioned Act on the 28th day of November 1958, made an Order entitled the Shipley No. 1 (Saltaire) Smoke Control Order, 1958, declaring the area described in the Schedule hereto to be a smoke control area, which Order is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

2. Subject to the exemptions provided by virtue of section 11 (4) of the Act if, on any day after the Order has come into operation, smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the smoke control area the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £10 unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than an authorised fuel. The authorised fuels include anthracite, coke and other carbonised fuels, gas and electricity.

3. Copies of the Order and of the map referred to therein may be inspected free of charge at the office of the Clerk of the Council, Town Hall, Shipley, at all reasonable times during the period of six weeks from the 12th day of December 1958.

4. Within the said period any person who will be affected by the Order may by notice in writing to the Secretary, Ministry of Housing and Local Government, Whitehall, London S.W.1, object to the confirmation of the Order.

## SCHEDULE

## Description of Smoke Control Area

That part of the West Ward of the Urban District of Shipley to the North of Bingley Road and to the West of Victoria Road but also including the premises in the Central Ward of the said District on the Easterly side of Victoria Road between Bingley Road and Saltaire Road and that part of Saltaire village bounded by Victoria Road, Caroline Street, Exhibition Road and Saltaire Road.
