

## BOROUGH OF CHELMSFORD

*Borough of Chelmsford (Townfield Street and Railway Street) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order, 1958*

*Borough of Chelmsford (Broomfield Road) (Unilateral Waiting) Order, 1958*

On the 26th November 1958, The Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Chelmsford acting by the Council of the said Borough made Orders under the Road Traffic Act, 1930, as amended, the effect of which is:

- (a) to prohibit the waiting of vehicles in any of the lengths of road specified in Part I of the Schedule hereto between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on weekdays.
- (b) to institute unilateral prohibition of waiting in the length of road specified in Part II of the Schedule hereto between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on weekdays.

Exceptions have been provided in the Orders to enable a vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for a person to board or alight from the vehicle, to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle, or to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with any funeral, building operation, or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the road, or the services therein.

## GLOUCESTERSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

*The Gloucestershire County Council (Minchinhampton) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order, 1958*

The Gloucestershire County Council propose to make an Order under the Road Traffic Act, 1930, as amended, the effect of which will be to prohibit the waiting of vehicles in any of the lengths of road specified in the Schedule hereto.
