Chichester Rural District Council Itchenor Park Footpath No. 2817 Diversion Order, 1958

Notice is hereby given that the above Order was made on the 3rd day of September 1958, and is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

The Order relates to land situate in the parish of West Itchenor.

The effect of the Order will be to divert two lengths of the public right of way which runs through Itchenor Park, one length being east of Itchenor House and the other length being east and south of Newbarn Copse north-westwards to the foreshore to a line—

- (i) As to the first length—commencing at the junction of the access road to Itchenor Farm and Itchenor House at the south-eastern end of the length of path to be stopped up and running north for a distance of 380 feet and then west for a distance of 350 feet to the north-western end of the length of path to be stopped up.
- (ii) As to the second length—commencing at the north-eastern end of the length of path to be stopped up and proceeding north-westwards north of Newbarn Copse for a distance of 600 feet to meet an existing public footpath along the foreshore at Horse Pond Saltings.

A certified copy of the Order and of the map contained in the Order has been deposited at the Council Offices, Pallant House, Chichester, and will be open for inspection free of charge between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays and from 9 a.m. to 12 noon on Saturdays.

Any objection or representation with reference to the Order may be sent in writing to the Secretary, Ministry of Housing and Local Government, Whitehall, London S.W.1, before the 8th January 1959, and any such objection or representation should state the grounds on which it is made.

Chichester Rural District Council, Westergate, Aldingbourne Footpath Extinguishment Order, 1958.

Notice is hereby given that on the 21st day of November 1958, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed the above Order.

The effect of the Order will be to extinguish, at the expiration of twenty-one days from the 21st November 1958, the public footpath at Westergate in the Parish of Aldingbourne, leading from the western boundary of the school site at Westergate at a point 275 feet south of Nyton Road in a south-westerly direction across privately owned land for a distance of 35 feet to an existing public footpath on the boundary of the school site.

Byelaws
