

"And whereas the Right Reverend Roger, Bishop of Chichester, consents to the proposed arrangements (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme);

"Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of publication in the *London Gazette* of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the boundaries of the said parishes of Easebourne; Fernhurst and Bignor shall be altered in the manner described in the Schedule hereto and delineated on the map annexed to this Scheme.

"THE SCHEDULE

"(1) The territory to be annexed to the parish of Fernhurst:

"all that part (coloured pink on the map annexed hereto) of the parish of Easebourne which lies to the east and north of a continuous imaginary line commencing on the boundary which divides the last mentioned parish from the parish of Fernhurst at a point on the eastern boundary of close numbered 20 on the map and continuing southwards along the said boundary and along the western boundary of close numbered 48 and in a straight line in continuation thereof to the fence forming the southern boundary of close numbered 56a and continuing thence eastwards along the last mentioned fence to its end and in a straight line to the southern end of the wall or fence forming the western boundary of close numbered 43 (thereby crossing the Midhurst to Haslemere road) and thence generally eastwards along the walls or fences

forming the southern boundaries of closes numbered 43, 72, 73, 77, 148, 156, 157, the southern and southeastern boundaries of close numbered 159 and the southeastern boundary of close numbered 40 to the boundary which divides the parish of Easebourne from the parish of Fernhurst.

"(2) The territory to be annexed to the parish of Easebourne:

"all that detached part (coloured blue on the map) of the parish of Bignor which is bounded on the south and southwest by the parish of Midhurst and on the remaining sides by the parish of Easebourne."

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the *London Gazette* pursuant to the said Measure.

And Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Chichester.

Whereas the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 20th day of November 1958, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Church Commissioners, in pursuance of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners (Exchange of Patronage) Act, 1853, and of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners Act, 1860, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting an exchange of the alternate right of the patronage of the benefice of Mavis Enderby with Raithby (now vested in the Board of Patronage of the diocese of Lincoln) for the alternate right of the patronage of the benefice of Toft with Newton by Toft (now vested in Your Majesty, Your Heirs and Successors, and exercised on behalf of Your Majesty by the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain for the

time being) both of which said benefices are situate in the diocese of Lincoln and we do hereby certify that we have made due inquiry into the respective circumstances and present values of the said benefices and that they are as set forth in the Schedule to the said Scheme.

"SCHEME

"With the consent of the Board of Patronage of the diocese of Lincoln, and of the Right Honourable David Patrick Maxwell, Viscount Kilmuir, now Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain (in testimony whereof they have executed this Scheme) the said alternate right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Mavis Enderby with Raithby shall be transferred to Your Majesty, Your Heirs and Successors and be exercisable by the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain for the time being on behalf of Your Majesty and in exchange for the same the said alternate right of patronage of and presentation to the benefice of Toft with Newton by Toft shall be transferred to and be exercisable by the said Board of Patronage of the diocese of Lincoln.

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, and the Diocesan Stipends Fund Measure, 1953, now

humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Harry, Bishop of Oxford, (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme), for effecting the union of the benefice of Aston Clinton, the benefice of Buckland and the benefice of Drayton Beauchamp, all situate in the diocese of Oxford.

"1. *Union of benefices.* The benefice of Aston Clinton, the benefice of Buckland and the benefice of Drayton Beauchamp shall be permanently united
