The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that they have made an Order under sections 1, 2 and 13 of Import Duties Act, 1958, and paragraph 1 of the Sixth Schedule to that Act, viz.:

The Import Duties (General) (No. 3) Order, 1958.

This Order amends the Import Duties (General) Order, 1958 (S.E. 1958 No. 973), which comes into operation on 1st January 1959, by increasing from 10 per cent. to 33½ per cent. ad valorem the duty on vitamin A (but not including natural vitamin concentrates) and on certain preparations containing that product and by decreasing from 30 per cent. to 25 per cent. ad valorem, the duty on certain glass bottles and jars.

The Order comes into operation on 1st January 1959 and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1958, No. 2223.

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that they have made an Order under section 3 (6) and section 13 of the Import Duties Act, 1958, viz.:

The Import Duties (Temporary Exemptions) (No. 2) Order, 1958.

This Order provides that the goods listed in the Schedule shall be temporarily exempt from protective duties which come into force on the 1st January 1959, under the Import Duties Act, 1958. The period of exemption is nine months unless a shorter period is indicated against any item in the Schedule. The goods include, under heading 29.08, the substance previously included in error under heading 29.07 (cf. Art. 1 (3) of this Order).

The Order comes into operation on 1st January 1959 and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1958, No. 2224.

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
