## CHURCH COMMISSIONERS

In the matter of an Act of Parliament passed in the 41st year of the reign of His Majesty King George III entitled "An Act for Dividing, Allotting, and Inclosing the Open Common Fields, Meadows, Pastures, and other Commonable Lands and Waste Grounds, within the Parish of Scremby, in the County of Lincoln".

Take notice that application will be made under the above mentioned Act by the Church Commissioners for England (in whom the Corn Rents formerly payable to the Incumbent of the benefice of Scremby are now vested by virtue of the Tithe Act, 1925, and the Church Commissioners Measure, 1947), at the General Quarter Sessions of the Peace to be held in and for the Parts of Lindsey in the County of Lincoln on the 5th day of March 1959, to have three persons named and appointed by the Justices then and there assembled to be Arbitrators or Referees for enquiring into and ascertaining the average price of a Winchester bushel of good marketable wheat within the said County of Lincoln for the 21 years then last past to the intent that the amount of the said Corn Rents may be reascertained and declared pursuant to the first above mentioned Act.
