YORK WATER

Notice is hereby given that the York Waterworks Company (hereinafter referred to as "the Company") are applying to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for an Order under sections 23, 32 and 33 of the Water Act, 1945.

The Councils of the Administrative Counties of the North Riding of Yorkshire, the East Riding of Yorkshire and the West Riding of Yorkshire, the Lord Mayor Aldermen and Citizens of the City and County Borough of York and the Councils of the respective Rural Districts of Tadcaster, Derwent, Flaxton and Nidderdale are the local authorities of the counties and districts within which the Company are supplying water.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTS
AND CLEAN AIR ACT, 1956

URBAN DISTRICT OF ROYTON

The Flake Lane Area Smoke Control Order, 1959

1. Notice is hereby given that the Urban District Council of Royton in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 11 of the above-mentioned Act on the 4th day of February 1959, made an Order entitled the Flake Lane Area Smoke Control Order, 1959, declaring the area described in the schedule hereto to be a smoke control area, which Order is

about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

2. Subject to the exemptions provided by the Order and by virtue of section 11 (4) of the Act if, on any day after the Order has come into operation, smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the smoke control area the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £10 unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than an authorised fuel. The authorised fuels include anthracite, coke and other carbonised fuels, gas and electricity.

3. Copies of the Order and of the Map referred to therein may be inspected free of charge at the Clerk's Office, Town Hall, Royton, at all reasonable times during the period of six weeks from the 21st day of February 1959.

4. Within the said period any person who will be affected by the Order may by notice in writing to The Secretary, Ministry of Housing and Local Government, Whitehall, London S.W.1, object to the confirmation of the Order.
