HONOURS AND AWARDS

PRESENT,

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 12th day of February 1959, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for altering the boundaries of the parishes of Blyth and Scrooby, both in the diocese of Southwell.

"SCHEME

"Whereas we are satisfied that it is desirable that the boundaries of the said parishes should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Russell, Bishop of Southwell, consents to the proposed arrangements (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme):

"Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of publication in the *London Gazette* of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the boundaries of the said parishes of Blyth and Scrooby shall be altered in the manner described in the Schedules hereto and delineated on the map annexed to this Scheme.

"THE SCHEDULE

"The territory to be annexed to the parish of Scrooby:

"All that part (coloured pink on the map annexed hereto) of the parish of Blyth which lies to the north and east of an imaginary line commencing on the boundary which divides the parish of Sutton cum Lound from the parish of Blyth at the point where the said boundary meets the boundary which divides the civil parish of Torworth from the civil parish of Barnby Moor and extending thence westwards along the said civil parish boundary to a point in the middle of the Blyth to Barnby Moor road (numbered A634 on the map), thence northwestwards along the middle of the said road to a point opposite the middle of the southern end of Sycamore Lane, thence northwards to and along the middle of Sycamore Lane and in a straight line in continuation thereof to the middle of Graves Moor Lane, thence northeastwards along the middle of Graves Moor Lane to the middle of its junction with Moor Lane, thence in a straight line northeastwards to the point where the southern boundaries of closes numbered 14 and 15 (on the map) meet, thence first northeastwards then northwards along the southeastern and eastern boundaries of close numbered 15 to the southern boundary of close numbered 7, thence first eastwards then northwards along the southern and eastern boundaries of close numbered 7 to the southern boundary of close numbered 234, thence in a straight line northwards across closes numbered 234 and 219 to a point in the middle of Blyth Road situate 250 yards northeastwards of the southeastern corner of the gardens and grounds of the house and premises known as Ranskill Grange (numbered 236 on the map), thence southwestwards along the middle of Blyth Road to the boundary which divides the civil parish of Ranskill from the civil parish of Blyth, thence northwards along the last mentioned civil parish boundary to the boundary which divides the parish of Blyth from the parish of Scrooby."

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the *London Gazette* pursuant to the said Measure.

And Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Southwell.
