PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 13th day of March 1959, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for (1) altering the boundaries of the parishes of Bradworthy with Pancraswyke, Holsworthy with Cookbury, Pyworthy and Sutcombe and (2) altering the names of the parishes of Bradworthy with Pancraswyke and Pyworthy, all of which parishes are in the diocese of Exeter.

#### "SCHEME

"Whereas we are satisfied that it is desirable that the boundaries of the said parishes should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas it has been represented to us, and it appears to us that the names of the parishes of Bradworthy with Pancraswyke and Pyworthy should be altered as hereinafter recommended and proposed:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Robert, Bishop of Exeter, consents to the proposed arrangements (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme):

"Now, therefore, we do humbly recommend and propose as follows:

"From and after the day of the date of publication in the *London Gazette* of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme:

"(1) The boundaries of the said parishes of Bradworthy with Pancraswyke, Holsworthy with Cookbury,

Pyworthy and Sutcombe shall be altered in the manner described in the Schedule hereto and delineated on the map annexed to this Scheme,

"(2) with the consent of the parochial church council of the said parish of Bradworthy with Pancraswyke, and with the consent of the parochial church council of the said parish of Pyworthy (in testimony whereof this Scheme is signed by the Chairman of and two other members present at a meeting of each council duly convened for the purpose of giving such consent) the name of the parish of Bradworthy with Pancraswyke shall be altered to 'The Parish of Bradworthy' and the name of the parish of Pyworthy shall be altered to 'The Parish of Pyworthy with Pancraswyke'.

#### "THE SCHEDULE

"The territory to be annexed to the parish of Pyworthy:

"(a) all that detached part of the parish of Bradworthy with Pancraswyke, comprising the chapelry of Pancraswyke, and all that detached part of the parish of Sutcombe, (together coloured pink on the map annexed hereto) both of which parts are included within the area of the civil parish of Pancrasweek,

"(b) all that part (coloured green on the map) of the parish of Holsworthy with Cookbury which is bounded on the east by the parish of Pyworthy, on the south, west and northwest by the territory annexed to the parish of Pyworthy in accordance with clause (a) of this Schedule and on the northeast by a continuous imaginary line commencing on the eastern boundary of the territory described in clause (a) opposite to the western end of the northeastern boundary of close numbered 981 and continuing thence southeastwards to and along the last mentioned boundary and the northeastern boundary of close numbered 829 and in a straight line in continuation thereof to the boundary which divides the parish of Holsworthy with Cookbury from the parish of Pyworthy."

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the *London Gazette* pursuant to the said Measure.

And Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Exeter.
