Whereas the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 25th day of March 1959, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952 and the Ecclesiastical Commissioners (Powers) Measure, 1938, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Geoffrey, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme), for effecting (i) the unions of (i) the benefices of Saint Dunstan, Canterbury, and part of the benefice of Saint Peter with Holy Cross, Canterbury; (ii) the benefice of Saint Martin with Saint Paul, Canterbury, and part of the benefice of Saint George the Martyr with Saint Mary Magdalene, Canterbury; (iii) the benefice of Saint Mary Bredin, Canterbury, and a further part of the benefice of Saint George the Martyr with Saint Mary Magdalene, Canterbury; and (iv) the benefice of Saint Alphege with Saint Margaret, Canterbury, the remaining part of the benefice of Saint Peter with Holy Cross, Canterbury, and the remaining part of the benefice of Saint George the Martyr with Saint Mary Magdalene, Canterbury: (2) an

alteration of the boundaries of the parishes of Saint Dunstan, Canterbury; Harbledown; Hackington; Holy Cross, Canterbury; Saint Peter, Canterbury; Saint Alphege with Saint Margaret, Canterbury; Saint Mary Bredin, Canterbury; Saint Paul, Canterbury; and Saint Mary Magdalene, Canterbury, and (3) an alteration to Clause 4 of an Order of His late Majesty King George the Fifth in Council dated the 1st day of November 1928 and published in the *London Gazette* on the 2nd day of the same month relating to the proceeds of sale of the parsonage house of Saint Margaret with Saint Andrew and Saint Mary Bredman, Canterbury, all of which benefices and parishes are situate in the diocese of Canterbury.

#### "SCHEME

"1. *Union of the benefice of Saint Dunstan, Canterbury, and part of the benefice of Saint Peter with Holy Cross, Canterbury.*

"(1) That part of the benefice of Saint Peter with Holy Cross, Canterbury, which coincides with the area of the parish of Holy Cross, Canterbury, shall be severed from the said benefice and the part so severed and the benefice of Saint Dunstan, Canterbury, shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The Benefice of Saint Dunstan with Holy Cross, Canterbury', but the parishes of Saint Dunstan, Canterbury, and Holy Cross, Canterbury, shall, subject as hereinafter provided, continue in all respects distinct.

"(2) *Parsonage House.* Upon the union taking effect, the parsonage house now belonging to the benefice of Saint Peter with Holy Cross, Canterbury, shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the benefice of Saint Dunstan with Holy Cross, Canterbury.

"2. *Union of the benefice of Saint Martin with Saint Paul, Canterbury, and part of the benefice of Saint George the Martyr with Saint Mary Magdalene, Canterbury.*

"(1) That part of the benefice of Saint George the Martyr with Saint Mary Magdalene, Canterbury, which coincides with the area of the parish of Saint George the Martyr, Canterbury, lying to the south-east of the middle of Upper Bridge Street and Lower Bridge Street and to the northeast of the middle of Dover Street shall be severed from the said benefice and the part so severed and the benefice of Saint Martin with Saint Paul, Canterbury, shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The Benefice of Saint Martin with Saint Paul, Canterbury'.

"(2) The said area of the parish of Saint George the Martyr, Canterbury, and the parish of Saint Paul, Canterbury, shall, subject as hereinafter provided, be permanently united together and form
