

one parish (coloured pink on map A annexed hereto) for ecclesiastical purposes under the style of 'The Parish of Saint Paul, Canterbury', but the parish of Saint Martin, Canterbury, shall continue in all respects distinct.

"(3) *Parish Church.* The church of Saint Paul, Canterbury, shall be the parish church of the united parish of Saint Paul, Canterbury.

"(4) *Parsonage House.* Upon the union taking effect, the parsonage house now belonging to the benefice of Saint George the Martyr with Saint Mary Magdalene, Canterbury, shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the new benefice of Saint Martin with Saint Paul, Canterbury.

"(5) *Patronage.* After the union has taken effect, the right of presentation to the new benefice of Saint Martin with Saint Paul, Canterbury, shall be exercised solely by the patron of the constituent benefice of Saint Martin with Saint Paul, Canterbury.

"3. *Union of the benefice of Saint Mary Bredin, Canterbury, and a further part of the benefice of Saint George the Martyr with Saint Mary Magdalene, Canterbury.*

"(1) That part of the benefice of Saint George the Martyr with Saint Mary Magdalene, Canterbury, which coincides with the area of the parish of Saint George the Martyr, Canterbury, lying to the south-east of the middle of Upper Bridge Street and to the southwest of the middle of Dover Street shall be severed from the said benefice and the part so severed and the benefice of Saint Mary Bredin, Canterbury, shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The Benefice of Saint Mary Bredin, Canterbury'.

"(2) The said area of the parish of Saint George the Martyr, Canterbury, and the parish of Saint Mary Bredin, Canterbury, shall, subject as hereinafter provided, be permanently united together and form one parish (coloured pink on map B annexed hereto) for ecclesiastical purposes under the style of 'The Parish of Saint Mary Bredin, Canterbury'.

"(3) *Parish Church.* The church of Saint Mary Bredin, Canterbury, shall be the parish church of the united parish of Saint Mary Bredin, Canterbury.

"(4) *Patronage.* After the union has taken effect, the right of presentation to the new benefice of Saint Mary Bredin, Canterbury, shall be exercised solely by the patrons of the constituent benefice of Saint Mary Bredin, Canterbury.

"4. *Union of the benefice of Saint Alphege with Saint Margaret, Canterbury, the remaining part of the benefice of Saint Peter with Holy Cross, Canterbury, and the remaining part of the benefice of Saint George the Martyr with Saint Mary Magdalene, Canterbury.*

"(1) The benefice of Saint Alphege with Saint Margaret, Canterbury, the remaining part of the benefice of Saint Peter with Holy Cross, Canterbury, and the remaining part of the benefice of Saint George the Martyr with Saint Mary Magdalene, Canterbury, shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The Benefice of Saint Alphege with Saint Margaret and Saint Peter, Canterbury'.

"(2) The parish of Saint Alphege with Saint Margaret, Canterbury, the remaining part of the parish of Saint George the Martyr, Canterbury, and the parish of Saint Mary Magdalene, Canterbury, shall, subject as hereinafter provided, be permanently united together and form one parish (coloured pink on map C annexed hereto) for ecclesiastical purposes under the style of 'The Parish of Saint Alphege with Saint Margaret, Canterbury', but the parish of Saint Peter, Canterbury, shall continue in all respects distinct.

"(3) *Parish Church.* The church of Saint Alphege, Canterbury, shall be the parish church of the united parish of Saint Alphege with Saint Margaret, Canterbury.

"(4) *Patronage.* In every series of three successive turns of presentation to be made to the benefice of Saint Alphege with Saint Margaret and Saint Peter, Canterbury, after the union has taken effect, the patron of the benefice of Saint Alphege with Saint Margaret, Canterbury, shall have the first and second turns and the patrons of the benefice of Saint George the Martyr with Saint Mary Magdalene, Canterbury, shall have the third turn.

"5. *Alteration of Boundaries.*

"With the consents (which have been given to us in writing) of the Reverend Alan Leslie Lawler,

being the incumbent of the benefice of Saint Dunstan, Canterbury; of the Reverend Geoffrey Arthur Church, being the incumbent of the benefice of Harbledown; of the Reverend Arthur Richard Barnes, being the incumbent of the benefice of Hackington; of the Reverend William Atkinson Kendall, being the incumbent of the benefice of Saint Mary Bredin, Canterbury; and of the Reverend Colin Edward Herschel Perry, being the incumbent of the benefice of Saint Martin with Saint Paul, Canterbury, the boundaries of the parishes of Saint Dunstan, Canterbury; Harbledown; Hackington; Holy Cross, Canterbury; Saint Peter, Canterbury; Saint Alphege with Saint Margaret, Canterbury; Saint Mary Bredin, Canterbury; Saint Paul, Canterbury and Saint Mary Magdalene, Canterbury, shall be altered in the manner described in the Schedule hereto.

"6. *Proceeds of sale of a former parsonage house.*

"So much of Clause 4 of an Order of His late Majesty King George the Fifth in Council dated the 1st day of November 1928, and published in the *London Gazette* on the 2nd day of the same month uniting the benefice of Saint Margaret with Saint Andrew and Saint Mary Bredman, Canterbury, and the benefice of Saint Alphege with Saint Mary Northgate and All Saints, Canterbury, as relates to the application of the net proceeds of sale of the parsonage house of the said benefice of Saint Margaret with Saint Andrew and Saint Mary Bredman, Canterbury, shall be rescinded and the said net proceeds of sale together with all interest thereon shall be appropriated and held by us for the augmentation of the benefice of Saint Alphege with Saint Margaret and Saint Peter, Canterbury.

"7. *Taking effect of Scheme.*

"Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the *London Gazette*, all the provisions of this Scheme shall forthwith take effect, and with their consents (given as aforesaid):

"(a) the Reverend Alan Leslie Lawler, if he is then incumbent of the benefice of Saint Dunstan, Canterbury, shall be the first incumbent of the benefice of Saint Dunstan with Holy Cross, Canterbury;

"(b) the Reverend Colin Edward Herschel Perry, if he is then incumbent of the constituent benefice of Saint Martin with Saint Paul, Canterbury, shall be the first incumbent of the new benefice of Saint Martin with Saint Paul, Canterbury; and

"(c) the Reverend William Atkinson Kendall, if he is then incumbent of the constituent benefice of Saint Mary Bredin, Canterbury, shall be the first incumbent of the new benefice of Saint Mary Bredin, Canterbury.

"8. *Endowments.*

"Upon the unions taking effect:

"(a) the whole of the endowments and property now belonging to the benefice of Saint Peter with Holy Cross, Canterbury, shall be assigned and annexed to the benefice of Saint Dunstan with Holy Cross, Canterbury;

"(b) an annual sum of £150, being part of a larger annual sum at present payable by us to the benefice of Saint George the Martyr with Saint Mary Magdalene, Canterbury, shall be assigned and annexed to the benefice of Saint Alphege with Saint Margaret and Saint Peter, Canterbury; and

"(c) all other the endowments and property (except the parsonage house) of the benefice of Saint George the Martyr with Saint Mary Magdalene, Canterbury, shall be transferred to and be vested in us to be held as part of and for the benefit of our General Fund.

" SCHEDULE

"1. The territory to be annexed to the parish of Saint Paul, Canterbury:

"All that part (coloured pink on map A) of the parish of Saint Mary Bredin, Canterbury, which lies to the southeast of the northwestern boundary of No. 31 Ersham Road and to the northeast of the boundaries at the rear of Nos. 27, 29 and 31 Ersham Road.

"2. The territory to be annexed to the parish of Saint Mary Bredin, Canterbury:

"(a) All that part (coloured pink on map B) of the parish of Saint Paul, Canterbury, which lies to the north of the middle of the London to Dover line of British Railways (Southern Region) and
