*Aysgarth Rural District Council (Burtersett)
Diversion Order, 1959*

Notice is hereby given that on the 23rd day of April 1959, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed with modifications the above Order.

The effect of the Order is to divert as from 16th May 1959, a public right of way running on the South side of a house known as Ingledene in Burtersett near Hawes through a field numbered 54 on the Ordnance Map in an Easterly direction to a line on

the North side of the said house through the said field numbered 54 in an Easterly direction.
