

"(4) From a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Chorley from the parish of Saint George, Chorley, in the middle of Sandridge Avenue southwards along the middle of Sandridge Avenue to its end thence in the same straight line to the middle of Isleworth Drive thence southwestwards along the middle of Isleworth Drive to its end thence westwards in a straight line to the point in the middle of Collingwood Road which is on the boundary which divides the parish of Saint George, Chorley, from the parish of Chorley.

"5. The territory to be annexed to the parish of Saint George, Chorley:

"(1) All those parts (together coloured purple on the map annexed hereto) of the parish of Adlington which lie to the east and southeast of the area described in Part II of this Schedule and to the west and north of an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Saint George, Chorley, from the parish of Adlington in the middle of Black Brook and extending thence southwestwards along the middle of Black Brook to the point where it joins the River Yarrow and in a straight line in continuation thereof to the middle of the River Yarrow thence first generally southwestwards then generally northwestwards along the middle of the River Yarrow to the point where it meets the imaginary line described in Part II of this Schedule.

"(2) All that part (coloured blue on the map annexed hereto) of the parish of Saint James, Chorley, which lies to the west of the middle of the Bolton and Preston branch railway line of British Railways (London Midland Region).

"(3) All those four parts (coloured red on the map annexed hereto) of the parish of Chorley which are bounded on the south and southeast by the parish of Saint George, Chorley, and on the remaining sides by imaginary lines proceeding as follows:

"(a) From a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Saint George, Chorley, from the parish of Chorley in the middle of Sandridge Avenue northwards along the middle of Sandridge Avenue to its end thence in the same straight line to the middle of Walgarth Drive thence eastwards along the middle of Walgarth Drive to the boundary which divides the parish of Chorley from the parish of Saint George, Chorley.

"(b) From a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Saint George, Chorley, from the parish of Chorley in the middle of Ashfield Road northeastwards along the middle of Ashfield Road to a point opposite the middle of the northwestern end of the unnamed footpath leading across Coronation Park Recreation Ground in the direction of the western end of Gillibrand Street thence southeastwards to and along the middle of the said footpath to the boundary which divides the parish of Chorley from the parish of Saint George, Chorley.

"(c) From a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Saint George, Chorley, from the parish of Chorley in the middle of Devonshire Road northwards along the middle of Devonshire Road to a point opposite the middle of the western end of Peter Street thence eastwards to and along the middle of Peter Street to the boundary which divides the parish of Chorley from the parish of Saint George, Chorley.

"(d) From the point where the boundaries of the parishes of Chorley; Saint George, Chorley; and Saint James, Chorley, all meet northwards along the middle of the Bolton and Preston branch railway line of British Railways (London Midland Region) to a point over the middle of Brunswick Street thence westwards along the middle of Brunswick Street to its end thence in a straight line westwards across the Cattle Market to the middle of the eastern end of High Street thence westwards along the middle of High Street to the boundary which divides the parish of Chorley from the parish of Saint George, Chorley.

"PART II

(The new parish of Chorley All Saints)

"The area comprising:

"All those contiguous parts (coloured pink on the map annexed hereto) of the parishes of Adlington; Charnock Richard; and Saint George, Chorley, which taken together are bounded on the northwest by the parish of Chorley and on the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Chorley from the parish of Saint George, Chorley, in the middle

of Collingwood Road and extending thence southeastwards in a continuous line along the middle of Collingwood Road, Tootell Street, Weldbank Lane to a point in the middle of the junction of Weldbank Lane and Burgh Lane thence southwestwards along the middle of Burgh Lane to a point opposite the northeastern end of the northwestern boundary of close numbered 88 (on the map) thence southwestwards to and along the northwestern boundary of close numbered 88 to its end thence generally southwards along the western boundary of close numbered 88 and the northwestern boundary of close numbered 90 and in a straight line in continuation thereof to a point in the middle of the River Yarrow thence generally northwards along the middle of the River Yarrow to the point where the boundaries of the parishes of Saint George, Chorley, Charnock Richard and Chorley all meet."

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Blackburn.

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council
Whereas the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 9th day of April, 1959, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for altering the boundaries of the parishes of Castle Hall and Saint Paul, Stalybridge, both in the diocese of Chester.

"SCHEME

"Whereas we are satisfied that it is desirable that the boundaries of the said parishes should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Gerald, Bishop of Chester, consents to the proposed arrangements (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme):

"Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the boundaries of the said parishes of Castle Hall and Saint Paul, Stalybridge shall be altered in the manner described in the Schedule hereto and delineated on the map annexed to this Scheme.

"THE SCHEDULE

"The territory to be annexed to the parish of Castle Hall:

"All that part (coloured pink on the map annexed hereto) of the parish of Saint Paul, Stalybridge which lies to the southwest of an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Old Saint George's, Stalybridge from the parish of Saint Paul, Stalybridge in the centre of the Staly Bridge and extending thence eastwards along the middle of the said Bridge to the northwestern end of Mottram Road, thence first eastwards then southeastwards along the middle of Mottram Road to a point opposite the middle of the eastern end of the roadway leading into Cheetham Park, thence southwestwards to then generally southwestwards along the middle of the last mentioned roadway to a point in the middle of Acres Brook on the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Paul, Stalybridge from the parish of Castle Hall."
