And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette.

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council Whereas the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the let day of May 1959, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for constituting a new parish to be taken out of the parishes of All Saints, Habergham; Saint John the Baptist, Gannow; Holy Trinity, Habergham Eaves; and Saint Matthew the Apostle, Habergham Eaves; all in the diocese of Blackburn.

"Whereas we, the Church Commissioners, are satisfied that the spiritual interests of the area defined in the Schedule hereto and delineated on the map hereto annexed would be best served by constituting it a new parish:

"And whereas we are satisfied that a suitable endowment thereof will be provided:

"And whereas we have not approved any consecrated church within the area as suitable to be the parish church of the new parish:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Walter, Bishop of Blackburn (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and affixed his episcopal seal to this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners, do humbly recommend and propose as follows, that is to say:—

" 1. Constitution

"(a) As from the date of the licence thereto of a Minister the area defined in the Schedule hereto and delineated on the map hereto annexed shall be a separate district for spiritual purposes.

"(b) As from the date of the consecration of a church within the area approved by us, the said Church Commissioners, as suitable to be a parish church, or if the church is consecrated before such approval, the date of the approval, the said area shall become a new parish.

"(c) The name of the district (or parish as the case may be) shall be 'The District (or Parish) of Saint Mark, Burnley'.

"2. Archdeaconry and Rural Deanery

"The district (or parish) shall be in the Archdeaconry of Blackburn and in the rural deanery of Burnley.

"THE SCHEDULE

"The area comprising:

"All those contiguous parts (coloured pink on the map annexed hereto) of the parishes of All Saints, Habergham; Saint John the Baptist, Gannow; Holy Trinity, Habergham Eaves, and Saint Marthew the Apostle, Habergham Eaves which are bounded on the south by the parish of Saint Matthew the Apostle, Habergham Eaves, and on the southwest by the parish of Saint Leonard, Padiham, and on the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Leonard, Padiham, from the parish of All Saints, Habergham, in the middle of the Leeds and Liverpool Canal and extending thence generally northeastwards along the middle of the said canal until it meets the western boundary of the parish of Saint John the Baptist, Gannow, thence southeastwards along the last mentioned boundary to the middle of Gannow Lane to a point opposite the middle of an unnamed road 3 chains or thereabouts to the west of Peel Mill leading to Accrington Road thence southwards to and along

the middle of the said unnamed road to the middle of the main railway line of British Railways (London Midland Region) thence eastwards along the middle of the said railway line to the middle of Cog Lane to the middle of Accrington Road thence eastwards along the middle of Accrington Road (thereby following in part the boundary of the parish of Saint John the Baptist, Gannow) to the middle of Clough Street thence southwards along the middle of Clough Street to its end and in the same straight line to and then the middle of the said unnamed road to the middle of to its end and in the same straight line to and then eastwards along the middle of Howard Street to a point opposite the middle of the northern end of Bruce Street thence southwards to and along the middle of Bruce Street to its end thence in the same straight line to and eastwards along the middle of Colin Street to a point opposite the middle of the northern end of Paisley Street thence southwards to and along the middle of Paisley Street to its end thence in the same straight line to and eastwards along the middle of Harold Street to a point opposite the northern end of the eastern boundary of the house the northern end of the eastern boundary of the house and premises known as number 46 Harold Street thence southwards to and along the last mentioned boundary to its end then westwards along the rear boundary of the houses and premises known as numbers 46 to 52 Harold Street to its end thence generally southwards and southwestwards along the rear boundary of the houses and premises known as numbers 4 to 24 Kinross Street and numbers 2 to 126 Airdig Crescent to its end (thus crossing Melrose Airdrie Crescent to its end (thus crossing Melrose Avenue) thence southwestwards along the south-eastern boundary of the house and premises known as rumber 388 Cog (Lane to its end and thence in the same straight line to and southeastwards along the middle of Cog Lane to the middle of Coal Clough Lane thence southwestwards along the middle of Coal Clough Lane to a point opposite the northwestern end of the southwestern boundary of the house and premises known as number 262 Coal Clough Lane thence southeastwards to and along the last mentioned boundary to its end nhence southwards in a straight line to and thence southeastwards along the rear numbers 297 to 339 Cog Lane to its end thence southwards in a straight line to and then southeastwards along the rear boundary of the houses and premises known as numbers 341 to 361 Cog Lane to its end thence in the same straight line along the boundary between the houses and premises known as numbers 41 and 43 Forfar Street to its end thence in the same straight line to and southwestwards along the middle of Forfar Street to a point opposite the morthwestern end of the southwestern boundary of the house and premises known as number 50 Forfar Street thence southeastwards to and along the last mentioned boundary to its end and along the wall or fence in continuation thereof and along the rear boundary of the houses and premises known as numbers 413 to 443 Cog Lane to its end thence southeastwards along the rear boundary of the houses and premises known as numbers 386 and 388 Rossendale Road thence southwestwards allong the southdale Road thence southwestwards allong the south-eastern boundary of the house and premises known as number 388 Rossendale Road to its end thence in the same straight line to and westwards along the middle of Rossendale Road to a point opposite the middle of the eastern end of the unnamed footpath which leads westwards from Rossendale Road through close numbered 246 thence southwestwards to then westwards along the middle of the said flootpath to the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Matthew the Apostle, Habergham Eaves, from the parish of Saint John the Baptist, Gannow."

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Blackburn.
