FACTORIES ACT, 1937

The Minister of Labour and National Service hereby gives notice that on 21st May 1959, he made the First-aid Boxes in Factories Order, 1959, under section 45 of the Factories Act, 1937. This Order replaces the current Order made in 1938.

The Order specifies the standard of first aid boxes or cupboards required to be provided and maintained in factories.

Specifications for adhesive dressings for wounds, and for eye ointment, for which provision is made in the Order, are given in certificates of approval of the Chief Inspector of Factories.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

These Regulations revoke and replace the National Insurance (Overlapping Benefits) Amendment Provisional Regulations, 1959. They amend the National Insurance (Overlapping Benefits) Regulations, 1948, by providing that in the case of widows or certain unmarried dependants who receive a grant under a War Pensions Instrument by reason of the fact that they are over seventy years of age, benefit to or in respect of such persons under the National Insurance Act shall not be reduced on account of that grant.
