The Merchant Shipping (Safety Convention) (Kuwait) Order, 1959

#### PRESENT.

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas by section 31 of the Merchant Shipping (Safety Convention) Act, 1949 (12, 13 & 14 Geo. 6. c. 43), it is enacted that Her Majesty, if satisfied that the Government of any country has accepted the Safety Convention, may by Order in Council make a declaration to that effect:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in pursuance of the powers vested in Her by the aforesaid section and of all other powers enabling Her in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and doth hereby order, as follows:

1. It is hereby declared that the Government of Kuwait has accepted the Safety Convention.

2. This Order may be cited as the Merchant Shipping (Safety Convention) (Kuwait) Order, 1959, and shall come into operation upon the date of its publication in the London Gazette.

And whereas Her Majesty is satisfied that the Government of Kuwait has acceded to the Load Line Convention:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in pursuance of the powers vested in Her by the aforesaid section and of all other powers enabling Her in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and doth hereby order, as follows:

1. It is hereby declared that the Government of Kuwait has acceded to the Load Line Convention.

2. This Order may be cited as the Merchant Shipping (Load Line Convention) (Kuwait) Order, 1959, and shall come into operation upon the date of its publication in the London Gazette.
