Borough of Loughborough (Traffic Regulation) (No. 2) Order, 1959

The Loughborough Borough Council proposes to make an Order under the Road Traffic Act, 1930, as amended, the effect of which will be:

That no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to wait between 8 a.m. and 8 p.m.

(a) in any of the lengths of road specified in the First Schedule hereto;

(b) in the length of road specified in the first column of the Second Schedule hereto:

(i) on the side of the road specified opposite that length of road in the second column of the said Schedule on those days of the month which

(ii) on the side of the road specified opposite that length of road in the third column of the said Schedule on those days of the month which

bear odd numbers, or

(iii) on the side of that length of road on which
vehicles are not for the time being prohibited
from waiting by sub-paragraph (i) or (ii) of paragraph (b):

(a) for a longer period than thirty minutes; or(b) if a period of less than forty minutes has elapsed since the termination during the said

hours of the last period of waiting (if any) of the vehicle on that side.

Exceptions will be provided in the Order to enable vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary or a person to board or alight from the vehicle, to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle, or to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the road or the services therein.

The Order will not apply to any vehicle owned by a Funeral Director, or owner of funeral vehicles when in use as part of a funeral cortege, or otherwise in connection with a funeral.

A copy of the proposed Order and a map indi-cating the proposals will be available during normal office hours for inspection at my office.

- 4. Broad Street, between its junction with Ashby Road and a point 50 yards in a northerly direction.

BOROUGH OF MAIDENHEAD

The Maidenhead Borough Council (Traffic Regulation)
Orders Nos. 2 and 3, 1959

PEMBROKESHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

The County of Pembroke (Upper Frog Street, Tenby) (Road Restriction) Order, 1959

On the 11th August 1959, the Pembrokeshire County council made an Order under the Road Traffic Act, 1930, as amended, the effect of which will be that no vehicle shall be driven in Upper Frog Street, Tenby, otherwise than in the direction from South to North; and that no vehicle shall be permitted to

wait between the hours of 8 a.m. and 8 p.m. in Upper Frog Street aforesaid on the East side of the road or on its West side except for two short sections—one for a distance of 17 yards South of the Coburg Hotel garage entrance, and the other for a distance of 23 yards opposite Bank Lane, on both of which sections limited waiting for half an hour in any period

of one hour will be permitted.

There will be exceptions for persons boarding or alighting from vehicles, for the loading and unloading of goods, and for vehicles which are being used in connection with building operations and similar ventors. works.
