Notice is hereby given that the Devon County Council, in exercise of the powers conferred on them by subsection (3) of section 29 of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, have determined to modify the particulars contained in the Draft Rights of Way Map and Statements prepared under section 27 of the above mentioned Act in relation to the rights of way in the Broadwoodwidge Rural District within the area of the said Council as follows:

Parish	Path No.	Modification
St. Giles-on-the-Heath.	5	Add bridleway from road at West Panson in a north-westerly direction to road at Hele.
	6	Add bridleway from road at West Panson in a north-easterly direction to road west of East Panson.

These paths are shown on a map which has been deposited at the respective offices of the Clerk of the County Council at The Castle, Exeter, and the Clerk of the Broadwoodwidge Rural District Council, at The Council Offices, 20 Western Road, Launceston, and may be seen there free of charge during the usual office hours.

Any representation or objection with respect to this determination shall be made in writing addressed to the Clerk of the County Council, The Castle, Exeter, on or before the 22nd day of September 1959, and shall state the grounds on which it is made.

OUNDLIE AND THRAPSTON RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL

Oundle and Thrapston Rural District Council (Warmington) Diversion Order, 1959

Notice is hereby given that on the 12th day of August 1959, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed, with modifications, the above-mentioned Order.

The effect of the Order is to extinguish from the 12th September 1959, the public rights of way over the land situate at Warmington shown coloured brown on the map annexed to the Order and described in A of the Schedule to the Order and to create from the 12th September 1959 public rights of way over the land situate at Warmington described in B of the Schedule to the Order and shown coloured green and yellow respectively on the map annexed to the Order.

A certified copy of the Order and of the map contained in the Order as confirmed by the Minister has been deposited at The Council Offices, Midland Road, Thrapston, Kettering, and will be open for inspection free of charge between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays and 9 a.m. to 12 noon on Saturdays.

The Order becomes operative as from the 18th day of August 1959, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order he may, within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice, make application to the High Court.
