

**THE COUNCIL OF THE COUNTY BOROUGH

The Council of the County Borough of Eastbourne (Bridleways Nos. 9 and 20) Diversion Order, 1959.

Notice is hereby given that on the 14th day of August 1959, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed, with modifications, the above Order. The effect of the Order is to divert:

(a) The part of the public right-of-way known as Bridleway No. 20 which runs across land at Cornish Farm from a point on the East Dean Road approximately 1,266 yards west of Halfway Cottages in a general southerly direction for a distance of approximately 893 yards to a point approximately 35 yards north-east of New Barn to:

(i) A line running from a point on the East Dean Road approximately 1,066 yards west of Halfway Cottages in a general south-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 600 yards and thence, in a general south-westerly direction for a distance of approximately 233 yards to a point approximately 35 yards north-east of New Barn.

(ii) A line running from a point on the East Dean Road approximately 1,466 yards west of Halfway Cottages in a general south-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 920 yards to a point approximately 50 yards south-west of New Barn.

(b) The part of the public right-of-way known as Bridleway No. 9 which runs across land at Cornish Farm from a point approximately 567 yards west of New Barn in a general north-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 820 yards to a point approximately 350 yards north of New Barn to a line running from the said point approximately 567 yards west of New Barn in a general north-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 800 yards and thence in a general south-easterly direction for a distance of 167 yards to the said point approximately 350 yards north of New Barn.

The old public rights-of-way will be closed as and from the 11th day of September 1959.

A certified copy of the Order and of the map contained in the Order has been deposited at the Town Hall, Eastbourne, and will be open for inspection free of charge during the normal office hours. The Order becomes operative as from the 22nd day of August 1959, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order, he may, within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice make application to the High Court.

CHERTSEY URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL

Chertsey Urban District Council Woodham Park Road—Rowtown Footpath Diversion Order, 1959

Notice is hereby given that the above Order was made on the 27th day of May 1959, and is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

The Order relates to land situate in the New Haw Ward of the Urban District of Chertsey.

The effect of the Order will be to divert a portion of the public right of way running from Rowtown to Woodham Park Road, New Haw, through land in the possession of the Ministry of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food, so that the public right of way will join Woodham Park Road at a point approximately 100 yards west from its present junction with Woodham Park Road.
