The following substantive Articles appear in each of the above Orders which prohibits the waiting of vehicles in a road or roads or institutes unilateral waiting in a road or roads:

- "Nothing in Article () of this Order shall prevent any person from causing or permitting a vehicle to wait in the length of road referred to in that Article for so long as may be necessary:
 - (a) to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
 - (b) to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle;
 - (c) to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of any length of road so referred to, or the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or near the said length of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telegraph line as defined in the Telegraph Act 1878; or
 - (d) to enable the vehicle to take in petrol, oil, water or air from any garage situated on or adjacent to the said length of road;
 - (e) in the case of any vehicle owned by a funeral director or owner of funeral vehicles when in use as part of a funeral cortege or otherwise in connection with a funeral,

The Interpretation Act 1889, shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament".

LOUGHBOROUGH BOROUGH COUNCIL

The Borough of Loughborough (Traffic Regulation) (No. 4) Order, 1959

The Loughborough Borough Council proposes to make an Order under the Road Traffic Act, 1930, as amended, the effect of which will be:

- 1. That no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to wait between 8 a.m. and 8 p.m.—
 - (a) in any of the roads or lengths of road specified in the First Schedule hereto;
 - (b) in the length of road specified in the first column of the Second Schedule hereto-
 - (i) on the side of the road specified opposite that length of road in the second column of the said Second Schedule on those days of the month
 - which bear even numbers; or

 (ii) on the side of the road specified opposite
 that length of road in the third column of the said Second Schedule on those days of the month
 - which bear odd numbers; or
 (iii) on the side of that length of road on which vehicles are not for the time being pro-hibited from waiting by sub-paragraph (i) or (ii) of paragraph (b):
 - (a) for a longer period than thirty minutes; ÐΤ
 - (b) if a period of less than forty minutes has elapsed since the termination during the said hours of the last period of waiting (if any) of the vehicle on that side.
- 2. That no person shall drive or cause or permit to be driven any vehicle in Packe Street, Lough-

borough, otherwise than from Frederick Street towards Granby Street.

3. That no person shall drive or cause or permit to be driven any vehicle in Granby Street, between its junction with Packe Street and its junction with Frederick Street, otherwise than from its junction with Packe Street towards Frederick Street.

Exceptions will be provided in the Order to enable a vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for a person to board or alight from the vehicle to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle, or to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the main-tenance of the road or the services therein.

Article 1 of the Order will not apply to any vehicle owned by a Funeral Director, or owner of funeral vehicles when in use as part of a funeral cortege, or otherwise in connection with a funeral.

1. Abbey Road (Class III, G.1)

West Side—between a point 60 yards south of its junction with Priory Road and the Abbey Gateway.
