NOTICE OF SEIZURE UNDER THE CUSTOMS AND EXCISE ACT 1952

Pursuant to section 275 (5) of the Customs and Excise Act, 1952, and paragraph 1 of the 7th Schedule thereto, the Commissioners of Customs and Excise hereby give you notice that by virtue of the powers contained in the Customs and Excise Acts and enactments amending those Acts, certain goods, to wit 126 cases, marked AB 1-126, containing final drive gear assemblies found at Goole, Yorkshire, on or about the 1st August 1959 have been seized as liable to forfeiture upon the grounds that the said goods are component parts of tanks or self propelled guns prohibited to be exported by the Export of Goods (Control) Order, 1959 (S.I. 1959 No. 161), and were brought to a place namely the quayside at Goole, Yorkshire, for the purpose of being exported and the exportation would have been contrary to the said prohibition. Whereby and by force of section 3 (1) of the Import, Export and Customs Powers Defence Act, 1939, and section 56 (1) of the Customs and Excise Act, 1952, the said goods are liable to forfeiture.

If you claim that the said goods are not liable to forfeiture you must within one month from the date of this notice of seizure give notice of your claim in accordance with the said Schedule to the said Act specifying the name and address of a solicitor in England who is authorised to accept service of process and to act on your behalf. In default of such notice the said goods will be deemed to have been duly condemned as forfeited and will be liable to be disposed of in such manner as the Commissioners of Customs and Excise may direct. If you make such claim within the time aforesaid, legal proceedings will be taken for the condemnation thereof.
