### CREDITON URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL

*Crediton Urban District Council (Downes Farm)  
Diversion Order, 1959*

Notice is hereby given that the above Order was made on the 28th day of September 1959 and is about to be submitted to the Minister of Town and Country Planning for confirmation.

The Order relates to land situate in the following parish: Parish of Crediton.

The effect of the Order will be to divert the public right of way running from the Exeter Road across O.S. 138 in Downes Farm to run alongside the Southern boundary of that field until it meets the hedge junction with O.S. 448 and thence in a North Westerly direction alongside the eastern hedge of O.S. 138.

## COUNTY OF THE WEST RIDING OF YORKSHIRE

### PUBLIC RIGHTS OF WAY

*Ascertainment of footpaths, bridleways and certain other highways.—Provisional Map and Statement*

Notice is hereby given that in accordance with section 30 (1) of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, the County Council of the West Riding of Yorkshire have prepared a Provisional Map and Statement of public rights of way (footpaths, bridleways and roads used as public paths) within the areas of the Borough of Ossett, the Urban Districts of Cudworth, Darfield, Darton, Denby Dale, Dodworth, Featherstone, Hemsworth, Horbury, Hoyalund Nether, Normanton, Penistone, Rothwell, Royston, Stanley, Stocksbridge, Wombwell and Worsborough, and the Rural Districts of Hemsworth (with the exception of the Parishes of Kirk Smeaton, Little Smeaton and Walden Stubbs), Penistone, Wakefield and Wortley.

The Provisional Map and Statement annexed thereto for the areas of the above-mentioned County Districts have been deposited for public inspection free of charge at the offices of the County Engineer and Surveyor at 93 Northgate, Wakefield, and may be seen there until the 3rd day of November 1959, between the hours of 8.45 a.m. and 5.20 p.m. on each week-day (other than Saturday).

During the same period copies of the Provisional Map and Statement so far as the same relate to each of the County Districts affected will be on deposit and may be inspected free of charge during normal office hours at the respective Council Offices except in the Rural Districts of Penistone and Wakefield where, in order to comply with the provisions of the Act that the relevant portions of the Provisional Map and Statement shall be available for inspection within the area to which they relate, they will be on deposit at the following places:

*Penistone Rural District*—The Offices of Winterbottoms (Wiredrawers) Ltd., Oxspring Wire Mills, Oxspring, near Sheffield.

*Wakefield Rural District*—The West Riding County Council Highways Depot, Durkar Lane, Durkar, near Wakefield.

Copies of the Statement so far as the same relates to the Rural Parishes in the County Districts affected will wherever practicable be on deposit in each Parish during the same period for public inspection. Particulars as to where such copies may be inspected in Rural Parishes will be supplied by the County Engineer and Surveyor, County Hall, Wakefield, on request.

At any time within twenty-eight days from the date of this notice the owner, lessee or occupier of any land shown on the Map to which this notice relates, being land on which the Map shows a public path, or a road used as a public path, may apply to Quarter Sessions for a declaration in accordance with section 31 (1) of the Act;

- (a) that at the relevant date mentioned in the Provisional Statement there was no public right of way over the land;
- (b) that the rights conferred on the public at that date by the public right of way over the land were such rights as may be specified in the application, and not such rights as are indicated in the Provisional Map and Statement;
- (c) that the position or width of that part of the land over which the public right of way subsisted at the said date was as specified in the application and not as indicated in the Provisional Map and Statement; or
- (d) that the public right of way over the land at the said date was not unconditional but was subject to limitations or conditions specified in the application, or, if the said right is indicated in the Provisional Statement as being subject to limitations or conditions, that the said right was subject to other limitations or conditions specified in the application either in addition to or in substitution for those indicated in the Provisional Statement.

A notice of application for a declaration should be addressed within the prescribed period to the Clerk of the Peace, County Hall, Wakefield, specifying the land to which the application relates, the grounds upon which the application is made, and that the County Council of the West Riding of Yorkshire are the Surveying Authority. A copy of the notice of application should also be served upon every other person appearing to the applicant to be the owner, lessee or occupier of the said or of any land specified in the application in regard to which the Court may make a direction, and also upon the County Council of the West Riding of Yorkshire addressed to the Clerk of the County Council, County Hall, Wakefield (see Public Rights of Way (Applications to Quarter Sessions) Regulations, 1952).

## RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL OF EASTRY

*Eastry Rural District (Aylesham) Extinguishment Order, 1959*
