

Regulations to restrict waiting by vehicles between the hours of 8.30 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive in:

1. Broad Lane, between Talbot Road and Antill Road.
2. White Hart Lane, between William Street and High Road.
3. High Road, from a point fifty feet north of Northumberland Park to a point one hundred feet south of White Hart Lane.
4. West Green Road (a) between High Road and Beaconsfield Road; and (b) between Belmont Road and Harringay Road.

(Exemptions would be provided in the Regulations to permit vehicles to wait—to pick up and set down passengers, to load and unload goods, to carry out essential services, or while in use by local authorities in an emergency.)

One-Way Traffic Working

Metropolitan Borough of Deptford

The Minister of Transport and Civil Aviation in accordance with the London Traffic Act, 1924, section 10, as amended, proposes to refer to the London and Home Counties Traffic Advisory Committee for their advice and report a proposal that he should make regulations to institute one-way traffic working from north to south in Laurie Grove, Deptford, between New Cross Road and Dixon Road.

This restriction is at present in operation on an experimental basis.

Weight Restriction

Hertfordshire County Council

The Minister of Transport and Civil Aviation in accordance with the London Traffic Act, 1924, section 10, as amended, proposes to refer to the London and Home Counties Traffic Advisory Committee for their advice and report a proposal that he should make Regulations to prohibit the driving of any vehicle the weight of which, whether laden or unladen, exceeds 2 tons, on that length of Lower Road, Amwell, in the Rural District of Ware, which is carried by the bridge known as Lowfield Bridge over the New River.

This notice supersedes that dated 17th November 1958, which advertised a proposal to impose a weight limit on Lowfield Bridge of 5 tons.

SALMON AND FRESHWATER FISHERIES ACT, 1923

Lancashire River Board Area

To Owners and Lessees of Fisheries and Other Persons Interested.

Whereas the Lancashire River Board has applied to the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food for an Order modifying the above-mentioned Act so that in the estuaries of the Rivers Kent and Leven within the Lancashire River Board area a licence for a lave net may be used only by the person to whom it has been granted, and may no longer be used by an agent or servant of the licence holder.

Now notice is hereby given that it is the intention of the Minister to make an Order, a draft of which has been prepared.

The draft Order may be inspected, and copies thereof obtained, free of cost, on application either to the Fisheries Secretary at the address below or to the Clerk of the Lancashire River Board, at 48 West Cliff, Preston, Lancs.

Any person objecting to any of the provisions of the draft Order should forward a statement of his objections to the Fisheries Secretary on or before, 9th November 1959, and a copy thereof to the Clerk of the River Board.
