TEES VALLEY AND CLEVELAND WATER

Notice is hereby given that due to the serious deficiency of water which has arisen by reason of an exceptional shortage of rain the Tees Valley and Cleveland Water Board are about to apply to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for an Order under section 1 of the Water Act, 1958.

The general effect of the Order will be by varying or amending for a period until the 31st December 1959 the provisions of sub-section 2 (a) of section 14 of the Tees Valley and Cleveland Water Act, 1959, to reduce the minimum flow over the weir at Broken Scar from the five million gallons per day prescribed therein to 0.5 million gallons per day.

Any person desiring to bring before the Minister of Housing and Local Government any objection to the application for the Order may do so by notice addressed to the Secretary, Ministry of Housing and Local Government, Whitehall, London S.W.1, quoting reference WS1/2642/215/01 and made within seven days from the date of this notice.
