#### CAERPHILLY URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL

Caerphilly Urban District (Lawrence Street, Caerphilly) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order, 1959

### CAERPHILLY URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL

The Caerphilly Urban District (Windsor Street, Caerphilly) (Unilateral Waiting) Order, 1959

#### DEVON COUNTY COUNCIL

The County of Devon (Instow Front Road) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order, 1959

The Devon County Council propose to make an Order under the Road Traffic Act, 1930, as amended, the effect of which will be that no person shall between the 1st day of March and the 30th day of September (both dates inclusive) in every year, cause or permit any vehicle to wait in any of the lengths of road specified in the Schedule to this Order.

Exceptions will be provided in the Order to enable a vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary to

enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle; to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle; to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the road or the services therein; to enable the vehicle to take in petrol, oil, water or air from any garage situated on or adjacent to any of the lengths of road; to enable the vehicle to be used as part of a funeral cortege or otherwise in connection with a funeral.

#### SCHEDULE

Lengths of Road in the Rural District of Barnstaple Instow Front Road

1. From the junction at Barton Cross, south-west-

wards for a distance of 370 yards.

2. From a point ten yards north of its junction with Lane End southwards for a distance of forty yards.

From a point sixteen yards north of its junction with Kiln Close Avenue southwards for a distance of forty yards.
 From a point 133 yards south of its junction with Kiln Close Avenue southwards for a distance of forty yards.

5. From a point ten yards north of its junction with Key Lane southwards for a distance of 120 yards.

From the Railway Crossing near Instow Station north-westwards for a distance of fifty-seven

## OXFORDSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING GENERAL DEVELOPMENT ORDER, 1950

Oxfordshire County Council (Permitted Development (Henley and Bix)) Direction, 1959

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the Administrative County of Oxford on the 25th day of September 1959, made a Direction entitled the "Oxfordshire County Council (Permitted Development (Henley and Bix)) Direction, 1959" under Article 4 of the Town and Country Planning General Development Order, 1950, directing that the permission granted by Article 3 of the said Order should not apply to development of Class VI (1) specified in the First Schedule to the said Order which comprises the erection of a building or buildings for the purpose of the breeding, hatching, rearing or housing prises the erection of a building or buildings for the purpose of the breeding, hatching, rearing or housing of chickens, other poultry or game in the area at Lambridge Hill partly in the Borough of Henley and partly in the Parish of Bix in the County of Oxford shown coloured pink on the plan annexed to the Direction, which said Direction was approved by the Minister of Housing and Local Government on the 5th day of October 1959.

The effect of the Direction as approved by the Minister is that within the said area a building or

Minister is that within the said area a building or buildings for the purpose of the breeding, hatching,

buildings for the purpose of the breeding, hatching, rearing or housing of chickens, other poultry or game must not be erected unless planning permission is granted on an application in that behalf.
