Whereas the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 18th day of September, 1959, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, and the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Harry, Bishop of Oxford (in witness whereof he has signed this Scheme), for effecting the union of the benefice of Stanton Harcourt and the benefice of Northmoor, both situate in the diocese of Oxford.

#### " Ѕснеме - . . . .

- "1. Union of Benefices. The benefice of Stanton Harcourt and the benefice of Northmoor shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United A Benefice of Stanton Harcourt and Northmoor' but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.
- "2. Taking effect of union. Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend Arthur Sherwood Caswell if he is then incumbent of the said benefice of Stanton Harcourt shall, with his consent (testified by his signature hereto) be the first incumbent of the united benefice.
  - "3 Parsonage House.
- "(a) After the union has taken effect and upon the provision at Stanton, Hargourt of a house approved

by us as suitable to be the house of residence for the incumbent of the united benefice, such house as aforesaid shall be the house of residence of the united benefice.

- "(b) Without prejudice to the exercise before the date when the union takes effect of any of the powers conferred by the Parsonage Measures, 1938 and 1947, the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Northmoor, if at that date it so belongs, and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall, so soon as conveniently may be, be sold, and disposed of by us at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and the net proceeds of such sale or sales shall be applied towards the cost of providing a house of residence at Stanton Harcourt as aforesaid.
- "4. Patronage. After the union has taken effect the right of presentation to the united benefice shall be exercised by the patrons of the two benefices alternately, the patron of the benefice of Stanton Harcourt having the first presentation to the united benefice to be made after the union."

"All that part (coloured green on the map annexed hereto) of the parish of Saint Jude, South Shields, which lies to the southeast of an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Oswin, South Shields, from the parish of Saint Jude, South Shields, in the middle parish of Saint Jude, South Shields, in the middle of Dean Road and proceeding thence southwestwards along the middle of Dean Road to the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Jude, South Shields, from the parish of Saint Mary, Jarrow Docks."

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for (1) altering the boundaries of the parish of Saint Barnabas, Knowle, in the diocese of Bristol and the parish of Whitchurch in the diocese of Bath and Wells and (2) constituting a new parish to be taken out of the said parishes of Saint Barnabas, Knowle, and Whitchurch.

#### " SCHEME

"Whereas we, the Church Commissioners, are satisfied (1) that it is desirable that the boundaries of the parishes of Saint Barnabas, Knowle, and Whitchurch should be altered in the manner described in Part I of the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map here annexed; and (2) that the spiritual interests of the area defined in Part II of the said Schedule and delineated on the said map would be best served by constituting it a new parish and that a suitable endowment thereof will be provided:

"And whereas we have not approved any con-secrated church within the area described in Part II of the said Schedule as suitable to be the parish

church of the new parish:

"Now, therefore, with the consents of the Right Reverend Oliver, Bishop of Bristol, and the Right Reverend William, Bishop of Bath and Wells (in testimony whereof they have executed this Scheme), we, the said Church Commissioners, do humbly recommend and propose as follows, that is to say:

"1. As from the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council confirming this Scheme the boundaries of the parishes of Saint Barnabas, Knowle, and Whitchurch shall be altered in the manner described in Part I of the subjoined Schedule and delineated on the map hereto annexed.

"2—(a) As from the date of the licence thereto of a Minister the area defined in Part II of the said Schedule and delineated on the said map hereto annexed shall be a separate district for spiritual

purposes. "(b) As from the date of the consecration of a church within the area approved by us, the said Church Commissioners, as suitable to be a parish church, or if the church is consecrated before such approval, the date of the approval, the said area

approval, the date of the approval, the said area shall become a new parish.

"(c) The name of the district (or parish as the case may be) shall be 'The District (or Parish) of Holy Cross, Inns Court, Bristol'

"(d) The parish shall be in the Archdeaconry of Bristol and in the Rural Deanery of Bedminster.

"The territory to be annexed to the parish of Saint Barnabas, Knowle:

"All that part (coloured green on the map annexed hereto) of the parish of Whitchurch which lies to the northwest of the middle of Creswicke Road and to the east of the centre of the junction of Broadbury Road and Creswicke Road.

#### "PART II

"District of Holy Cross, Inns Court, Bristol

"All those parts (coloured pink on the map annexed hereto) of the parishes of Saint Barnabas, Knowle, and Whitchurch which are bounded on the southwest and part of the west by the parish of Saint Peter, Bishopsworth, on a further part of the west by the parish of Saint Dunstan, Bedminster; on part of the north by the parish of Saint John, Bedminster; and on the remaining sides by a continuous imaginary line commencing at a point, lettered A on the map, on the boundary which divides the parish of Saint John, Bedminister, from the parish of Saint Barnabas, Knowle, and continuing thence southwards along the eastern side of the footpath leading to Nover's Park eastern side of the footpath leading to Nover's Park Drive as far as the northwestern corner of the premises known as No. 57, Nover's Park Drive; southeastwards along the rear boundaries of the premises on the northeastern side of Nover's Park Drive and Nover's Park Road to the northeastern corner of the premises known as No. 41, Nover's Park Road; northeastwards in a straight line in continuation of the boundary between No. 41 and No. 43, Nover's Park Road to the boundary of Merrywood Grammar School: along the last mentioned wood Grammar School; along the last mentioned boundary in the same direction to the northwestern corner of the premises known as No 69, Downton Road and thence in the same line to the middle of Downton Road; southeastwards along the middle of Downton Road to its junction with Leinster Avenue; eastwards to the centre of the northeasterly junction of Leinster Avenue and Broadbury Road; southwards and southeastwards along the middle of Broadbury Road to its junction with Creswicke Road; eastwards

### THE APPLICATION OF SOUTHERN TELEVISION LIMITED

Short Particulars of the Decision

Southern Television Limited is a programme contractor, and as such is concerned to obtain a licence for musical works in the repertoire of the Performing Right Society to be broadcast by the Independent Television Authority. Its case was not covered by a licence scheme.

The Performing Right Society was prepared to grant such a licence, but only on the condition that a clause should be inserted in effect prohibiting the reproduction on records or cinematograph films either by the programme contractor or by the Independent Television Authority without terms having first been agreed with the owner of the recording right.

It was the contention of Southern Television Limited that that clause imposed terms or conditions

which were unreasonable; and it applied accordingly

which were unreasonable; and it applies accordingly to the Tribunal to have it so determined.

The case for Southern Television Limited was supported by the British Broadcasting Corporation, and that for the Performing Right Society by three bodies (which combined to form one interested party),

the product of the produ all being owners of copyright in the making of mechanical recordings.

The Performing Right Society maintained that if

and so far as a licence to broadcast carried with it any right to make a mechanical reproduction, this would constitute an infringement of the last-mentioned copyright, and frankly admitted that the clause which the application sought to impeach was deliberately designed to defeat whatever statutory provisions might have that effect.

The Tribunal did not find it necessary to determine the question of law as to whether or not there were statutory provisions which did have that effect. If there were no such provisions, then the insertion of the proposed clause was pointless. If, on the other hand, the legislature had thought fit so to provide, then it was unreasonable to compel Southern Television Limited against its will to contract out of any statutory rights which it might have. In either event, therefore, it was held to be unreasonable to include the proposed clause as a term or condition subject to which the Performing Right Society would grant the required licence to Southern Television Limited.

The Tribunal accordingly ordered that Southern Television Limited was entitled to be granted a licence in the form proffered by the Performing Right Society, but without the inclusion in its terms of the proposed

clause or any clause to the same or a like effect.

The Performing Right Society was ordered to pay the costs of Southern Television Limited.
