"The right of way is subject to all obstructions which may from time to time be caused by the use of the path for purposes connected with the navigation or maintenance of the Canal, and to the right of the British Transport Commission in their sole discretion from time to time to stop up the path and temporarily to discontinue a right of way in order to facilitate the execution of any works of maintenance or reconstruction of or connected with the Canal and the towpath or to alter or divert the line of the towpath and for any such purpose to erect all such barriers and to display all such notices on or near to the path as they may think fit".
