PRIVY COUNCIL OFFICE

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 20th day of November 1959

PRESENT,

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas the Minister of Housing and Local Government, after giving to the Incumbent and Churchwardens of the Parish of Hipswell, in the County of the North Riding of Yorkshire, ten days' previous notice of his intention in that behalf, has, under the provisions of the Burial Act, 1853, as amended by subsequent enactments, made a Representation to Her Majesty in Council that, for the protection of the Public Health, the opening of any new burial ground in the Civil Parish of Hipswell, in the said County of the North Riding of Yorkshire, save with the previous approval of the Minister of Housing and Local Government, should be prohibited, and that burials should be discontinued therein as follows, viz.:

Hipswell.—Forthwith and entirely in the Churchyard of St. John, Hipswell, Catterick Camp, in the said Parish,

Provided that—

- (a) In any earthen grave now existing in the said Churchyard, the burial may be allowed of the bodies of Rhona Squires, Ada Thompson, Amelia Thonpe, Martha Bramham and Jane Metcalfe.
- (b) In the said Churchyard, in a grave space in which no interment has heretofore taken place, the burial may be allowed of the body of Lillian Metcalfe for whom such grave space has been reserved and appropriated as a burial place, with the exclusive right of burial therein.

Subject in each case to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give Notice of such Representation and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 14th day of January next.

And Her Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the *London Gazette*, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the Churches or Chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the Parish affected by such Representation one month before the said 14th day of January.
