DISCONTINUANCE

THE BURIAL GROUNDS (POOLE) ORDER, 1959 Made 21st December 1959

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 21st day of December 1959

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council Whereas a Representation duly made to Her Majesty in Council by the Minister of Housing and Local Government that, for the protection of the Public Health, the opening of any new burial ground in the Borough and County of the Town of Poole, save with the previous approval of the Minister of Housing and Local Government, should be prohibited, and that burials should be discontinued therein as hereinafter

directed has, in pursuance of an Order in Council made the nineteenth day of October, 1959, and duly published, been taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred on Her by section one of the Burial Act, 1853 (16 & 17 Vict. c. 134), and of all other powers Her enabling, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

ordered, as follows:

1. No new burial ground shall be opened in the said Borough and County of the Town of Poole save with the previous approval of the Minister of Housing and Local Government, and burials shall be discontinued therein as follows, viz.:

Poole.—Forthwith and entirely in the Churchyard of the Parish Church of Longfleet St. Mary. Provided that-

(a) In any walled grave now existing in the said Churchyard, burial may be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such

grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b) In any earthen grave now existing in the said Churchyard, the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such

(c) In the said Churchyard, in two grave spaces in which no interment has heretofore taken place, the burial may be allowed at their decease of the bodies of Mrs. F. M. Bellamy and Miss F. L. Foreman for whom such grave spaces have been reserved and appropriated as burial places.

Subject in each case to the condition that no part of the coffins containing the bodies shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the ground adjoining the graves.

2. This Order may be cited as the Burial Grounds (Poole) Order, 1959. W. G. Agnew.
