

Town and Country Planning Act, 1947
Mineral Workings Act, 1951

The Minister of Transport hereby gives notice that he has made an Order under section 49 of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1947, and section 32 of the Mineral Workings Act, 1951, entitled "The Stopping up of Highways (County of Bedford) (No. 5) Order, 1959" authorising the temporary stopping up for a period of 15 years of a length of footpath at Reach Lane, Heath and Reach, Beds., and requiring the provision of a temporary new footpath and requiring the restoration of the old footpath at the end of that period.

Any person aggrieved by the Order and desiring to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1947, and the Mineral Workings Act, 1951, or that any requirement of these Acts or of any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within six weeks of the 5th January 1960, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.

Town and Country Planning Act, 1947

The Minister of Transport hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under section 49 of the above Act authorising the stopping up of lengths of two footpaths at Brook Road, Hartshorne, Derbyshire, in order to enable the land to be developed for residential purposes in accordance with planning permission granted to H. J. Warner Ltd. by Repton R.D.C.

The proposed Order will also require the provision of three new footpaths one of which will be maintainable at the public expense, for which the highway authority is to be the Derbyshire C.C.
