Statutory Instruments 1959 No. 2193

The Live Poultry (Restrictions) Amendment No. 2 Order, 1959

(Made 18th December 1959)

This Order, which applies in England and Wales only, comes into operation on 31st December 1959, and provides that notwithstanding the provisions of the Live Poultry (Restrictions) Order, 1957, under

which a local authority may grant a licence authorising sales by auction of store poultry to be held at any time except in October, November or December in any year, that power shall not be exercised so as to authorise such a sale in January, February or March, 1960.
