Awarded the British Empire Medal for Gallantry, (Civil Division)

Bernard Lawson Jenkins, Fisherman. Cyril Galvin Jenkins, Fisherman.

A storm raged through a fleet of fishing vessels in the Northumberland Strait, sinking 22 boats with the loss of 35 lives. The force of the gale capsized one boat and three members of the crew were caught in the cabin. Another wave turned the boat right side up and the men were able to clamber on to the bow. Bernard Jenkins and his nephew, Cyril Jenkins, who were nearby in their boat, saw the plight of the men were nearby in their boat, saw the plight of the men and immediately turned the boat to go to their help. Despite the gale force winds and mountainous seas, Bernard Jenkins manoeuvred his boat, three times, close enough for Cyril Jenkins to throw a life line to the men clinging to the bow of the other boat, and pull them to safety. Bernard and Cyril Jenkins risked their lives and displayed good seamanship and courage in effecting the rescue during the height of the storm.
