"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Launcelot, Bishop of Portsmouth (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme), for authorising the taking down and the sale of the site and materials of the church of Saint Bartholomew, Southsea, in the parish of The Holy Spirit, Southsea, in the diocese of Portsmouth.

- "1. As soon as conveniently may be after the day on which any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the church of Saint Bartholomew, Southsea, shall be taken down and the materials and site thereof, together with any ground annexed or belonging thereto shall be sold and disposed of by us at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the said Measures.
- "2. The net proceeds to arise from such sale or sales after payment of the expenses attendant thereon and upon the taking down of the church and all other expenses incidental to these matters shall be applied by us for the augmentation of the capital endowment of the benefice of The Holy Spirit, Southsea.
- "3. So much of the furniture and fittings of the said church of Saint Bartholomew, Southsea, as may conveniently be used in the parish church of The Holy Spirit, Southsea, shall, subject to the approval of the Bishop of Portsmouth, be transferred thereto and the residue of the said furniture and fittings shall be transferred to such other church or chapel or churches or chapels in the diocese of Portsmouth as the said Bishop may direct or shall (with the exception of the font, communion table and plate used for the purpose of the Holy Communion) be sold and in such case the proceeds shall be added to the fund arising from the sale of the site and materials of the said church of Saint Bartholomew, Southsea."

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, and the Diocesan Stipends Funds Measure, 1953, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Maurice, Bishop of Durham, (in witness whereof he has signed this Scheme), for effecting the union of the benefice of Stockton-upon-Tees and the benefice of Saint James, Stockton-upon-Tees, both situate in the diocese of Durham.

"1. Union of Benefices and Parishes. The benefice of Stockton-upon-Tees and the benefice of Saint James, Stockton-upon-Tees shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Stockton-on-Tees' and the parishes of the said benefices shall also be united into one parish for ecclesiastical purposes.

- "2. Taking effect of union. Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend Charles Noel Wardle-Harpur if he is then incumbent of the said benefice of Stockton-upon-Tees shall, with his consent (which has been given to us in writing), be the first incumbent of the united benefice.
- "3. Parish Church. The parish church of the parish of Stockton-upon-Tees shall be the parish church of the united parish.
- "4. Registers. After the union has taken effect the marriage registers current at the church of Saint James, Stockton-on-Tees shall be dealt with in accordance with Section 62 of the Marriage Act, 1949, and the register books (if any) of baptisms and hand the seconds and muniments burials and other the records and muniments deposited in the said church shall be transferred to the parish church of Stockton-upon-Tees.
- "5. Parsonage House. Without prejudice to the exercise before the date when the union takes effect of any of the powers conferred by the Parsonages Measures, 1938 and 1947, upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Stockton-upon-Tees shall, if at that date it so belongs to the said benefice, be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice and the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Saint James, Stockton-upon-Tees, if at that date it so belongs, together with the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall, as soon as conveniently may be, be sold and disposed of by us at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and the net proceeds of such sale or sales shall be placed to the credit of the Expenses Fund of the said diocese established pursuant to the 32nd Section of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.
- "6. Patronage. With the consent (which has been given to us in writing) of the Right Honourable Harold Macmillan, now First Lord of Your Majesty's Treasury on behalf of Your Majesty, as the patron of the benefice of Saint James, Stockton-upon-Tees, and with the consent, (testified as aforesaid) of the Right Reverend Maurice, Bishop of Durham, being the patron of the benefice of Stockton-upon-Tees, upon the union taking effect, the patronage of the upon the union taking effect, the patronage of the benefice of Saint James, Stockton-upon-Tees, shall, without any conveyance or assurance other than this scheme, be surrendered in favour of the said Maurice, Bishop of Durham, and his successors in the same Bishopric and the patronage of the united benefice shall belong wholly to the said Bishop of Durham for the time being.

"7. Taking down of church
"(1) As soon as conveniently may be after the union has taken effect the church of Saint James, Stockton-upon-Tees, shall be taken down and the materials and site thereof, together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof, shall be sold and disposed of by us at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the said Union of Benefices Measures.

"(2) The net proceeds to arise from such sale or sales, after payment of the expenses attendant thereon and upon the taking down of the church and all other expenses incidental to these matters, shall be placed to the credit of the said Expenses Fund of the said diocese.

"(3) The furnishings, that is to say, the font, communion table, plate used for the purpose of the Holy Communion, bells, organ and other furniture and fittings of the said church of Saint James, Stockton-upon-Tees, or such of them as the bishop of the said diocese may select, shall be transferred to the church of Stockton-upon-Tees or to such other church or chapel, churches or chapels within the said diocese as the said bishop may select, and any such furnishings not so transferred may, with the exception of the font, communion table and plate used for the purpose of the Holy Com-munion, be sold and in such case the proceeds shall be added to the fund arising from the sale of the site and materials of the said church of Saint James, Stockton-upon-Tees.

"8. Diversion of Endowment Income.

"(1) Subject as hereinafter provided, any surplus, calculated by us for the twelve months ending on the 31st March in each year, of the endowment income (calculated in accordance with the Schedule hereto) of the united benefice over and above an annual sum of £1,200 shall, with effect from the date upon which the union shall take effect, be paid to and be held by us, for the benefit of the diocesan stipends fund of the said diocese: Provided that if after the date upon which the union shall take effect any additional capital endowment shall accrue to or be acquired by the united benefice (not being capital endowment derived from the sale of any property of the united benefice) the sale of any property of the united henefice) the income from such subsequently acquired capital endowment shall not be taken into account for the purpose of calculating such surplus as aforesaid.

"(2) The said endowment income and the said surplus and the said annual sum of £1,200 shall be deemed to accrue from day to day and shall when we deem that circumstances so require be

apportionable accordingly.

- "(3) Any moneys due to us from the incumbent of the united benefice, or, during any vacancy in the united benefice, from the sequestrators thereof, as the case may be (hereinafter called the incumber of the case may be the case of the bent or sequestrators') upon the calculation of the said surplus shall be paid by the incumbent or sequestrators to us not later than the 30th June in each year and shall be recoverable as a debt due to us.
- "(4) For "(4) For the purpose of ascertaining the amounts of the said endowment income and of the amounts of the said endowment income and of the said surplus, we shall have power to require production by the incumbent or sequestrators of accounts and other documents in relation thereto, and the said accounts for the twelve months to 31st March in each year (or where applicable for a part of the year ending on that date) shall be rendered annually to us within six weeks of that date in such form as we shall prescribe; and in the event of failure by the incumbent or sequestrators to produce such accounts or documents we shall have all legal remedies for enforcing production thereof. tion thereof.

"For the purpose of this Scheme and subject to the proviso contained in clause 8 (1) thereof the endowment income of the united benefice shall, without prejudice to the power of decision vested in us by virtue of Section 18 of the Pastoral Reorganisa-tion Measure, 1949, if any question shall arise, be computed in accordance with our Central Register of Benefice Income, that is to say, by including:—

"(1) all gross secured income payable by us

and any other person or body, and

"(2) all gross income received from ground rents, chief rents or other fixed charges, other glebe rents and any letting of the parsonage house or a formally divided portion thereof, "and by deducting therefrom:-

"(1) the rates payable on the parsonage house if occupied by the incumbent,

"(2) the rent and rates payable on any house occupied by the incumbent other than the parsonage house.

"(3) the annual assessment charged upon the incumbent under the Ecclesiastical Dilapidations Measures, 1923 to 1951, in respect of the benefice,

"(4) the rates payable on the glebe,

"(5) the cost of collecting glebe rents,

"(6) any tithe annuity, rentcharge or fee farm rent charged upon the glebe,

"(7) any other outgoings in respect of the glebe,

- "(8) any charge upon the benefice income in favour of another benefice or any lay person,
- "(9) any payment to a curate or lay worker out of the benefice income,
- "(10) the annual payments in respect of capital and interest in respect of any mortgage of the benefice income,
- "(11) any part of the benefice income diverted to the diocesan stipends fund pursuant to an Order under Section 12 of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949."

" SCHEME

"Whereas we are satisfied that it is desirable that the boundaries of the said parishes should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:
"And whereas the Right Reverend Cuthbert, Bishop of Coventry, consents to the proposed arrangements (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme):
"Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the boundaries of the said parishes of Saint Mary, Warwick; Saint Paul, Warwick; Saint Nicholas, Warwick; Sherbourne; and All Saints, Emscote, shall be altered in the manner described in the Schedule hereto and delineated on the map annexed to this Scheme.

"1. The territory to be annexed to the parish of

Sherbourne:

"All that part (coloured green on the map annexed hereto) of the parish of Saint Mary, Warwick, which lies to the south of an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Sherbourne from the parish of Saint Mary, Warwick, the map) and proceeding theree portheastwards along the map) and proceeding thence northeastwards along the middle of Stratford Road to a point opposite the southeastern end of the southwestern boundary of close numbered 878, thence northwestwards to and along the last mentioned boundary to the northwestern corner of the last mentioned close, thence northeastwards along the northwestern boundaries of closes numbered 878 and 873 and in a straight line in continuation thereof to a point in the middle of the unnamed stream or brook which divides close numbered 873 from closes numbered 874 and 871, thence southeastwards along the middle of the last mentioned stream or brook to a point opposite the southwestern end of the northwestern boundary of close numbered 872 thence northeastwards to and along the last mentioned boundary to the northern corner of the last mentioned close there first south corner of the last mentioned close, thence first south-eastwards then northeastwards then southeastwards again along the northeastern boundary of close numbered 872 and in a straight line in continuation thereof to a point in the middle of Stratford Road, thence northeastwards along the middle of Stratford Road to a point over the middle of the culvert carrying the unnamed stream or brook which flows southeastwards to the Rivon Avon from close numbered 859, thence generally southeastwards along the middle of the last mentioned stream or brook to the point at which it joins the River Avon thence in a straight line due eastwards to a point in the middle of the River Avon on the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Mary, Warwick, from the parish of Barford.

lies to the north of the territory described in paragraph 1 of this Schedule and to the south of an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Budbrooke from the parish of Saint Mary, Warwick, in the middle of Birmingham Road and proceeding thence first eastwards then southeastwards along the middle of Birmingham Road and Saltisford to the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Paul, Warwick, from the parish of Saint Mary, Warwick, thence first generally southwards then generally southeastwards then generally northeastwards along the last mentioned generally northeastwards along the last mentioned boundary to the point where the last mentioned boundary turns westwards to meet Castle Lane, thence in a straight line southeastwards across Warwick Castle Park in the direction of the western corner of the Boat House situate in close numbered 2839 to a point in the middle of the River Avon on the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Mary, Warwick, from the parish of Saint Nicholas, Warwick.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

The provisions of these Regulations supplement those in sections 1 and 2 of the National Insurance Act, 1959, determining the liability for graduated contributions. They prescribe the manner in which the contributions payable are to be calculated and the treatment of remuneration not paid weekly. They make provision as to the contributions properly payable where an employed person has two or more employments and specify the payments which are not to be taken into account in deciding, for graduated contribution purposes, the amount of a person's remuneration. The Regulations include provision for securing that contribution liability is not avoided or reduced by the use of abnormal pay practices.
