PRESENT,

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 28th day of January 1960, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, and the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Hugh, Bishop of Newcastle (in witness whereof he has signed this Scheme), for effecting the union of the benefice of Alston with Garrigill, the benefice of Nenthead and the benefice of Kirkhaugh, all situate in the diocese of Newcastle.

"SCHEME

"1. *Union of Benefices.* The benefice of Alston with Garrigill, the benefice of Nenthead and the benefice of Kirkhaugh shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Alston cum Garrigill with Nenthead and Kirkhaugh' but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

"2. *Taking effect of union.* Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the *London Gazette* the union shall forthwith take effect.

"3. *Parsonage House.* Without prejudice to the exercise before the date when the union takes effect of any of the powers conferred by the Parsonages Measures, 1938 and 1947, upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Alston with Garrigill shall, if at that date it so belongs to the said benefice, be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice.

"4. *Patronage.* In every series of three successive turns of presentation to be made to the united benefice after the union has taken effect, the patron of the
