Deptfords Nos, 18, On, Manday laft a large fip of about 530 funss called the Rerletey-Cafte was lapnched at this place; whe name upon the defire of the owners having been given by the Right Hanourable the Lord Berkley of Berkley; his Lerddaip having likewife an interelt in her, acfpmpanied by feveral perfons of Quality there, prefent at the Ceremony; it being oblerved that this N ble Lord hath been al ways a loper of Mershants and an incourager of Trage.
Crazouie, Offob. 26. The States of Cracouie having by anew Papons Affembied themfelves and made choice of lome perfons to be their Reprefentaives in the greater Affembly; the faid perlons have been refuled entrance into the Diet, as have been alfoexcluded eight other Prop yinces whole Attemblies broke off before the Corronation \% wichout zuy yagreement.

The pataine of sendamir tiaving generoufly reminted the Govepnpent of Krofng into she Kings hands an ath fignationetwas prefently made afcordingsto a former A of 30 thoufand Liures a piece to the two Palatipates of Kiericand cherpokovie, put of whick adifitibution is to be made tofluely of the Noblafs in the faid Palprinates as were formety damnifis hy ths Rebellion of xhe Colfaclos in she Province of ukrania: since this the Deputies of she Palaigates of Erajlayiex Podolic and Volime have put in their claim for a reimburfoment of their Nobleffe out of fome other vacancies s whofe example is like to be followed by, the reff of the Provinces whoro importunizies if compljed withy will pauch prejudice His Majefties Soverignary by aking our of his hands the Collation of atl Chargesi and Governments till the States fiall ju.ge the fuffing par [ens tode fuffcienty feompented.

His Majefly having taken inro his confideastion the mat nyy. differeaces and onimani.ies among the Noblefs, which have put a fop to all procpedings relating to the publick, was pleared to employ feyeralof the Senators to them, vit. the Bilaop of Piostera apa the Palatines of Pofyde vies and Traki in hispmante, $\$ p$ insite chem to lunity, and ta conisider.che preferi ill condition of the affairs of the king-- doms twich heving not had thore good effeets which were defired, His Mojelly yefterday callęd His Privy Council to confider of the prefent pofture of affaifs, watrein a propofal was made for the dilfotution of the prefent Dict, and calling anopber to be hetd in Eebruary next,

The Count de lionze is lately arniyed base inu the name of His moft Chriftian King his malter, to Compliment -His Majefy ypon his Corogation, snd to follicia fut the nom , mination of the Bifoop of Befier to the digaity of Cardinal.

Genokan XVOv. 13 Twh days fince failed hence the three men of war which Segnior Aippolito Genturione engaged in thatervice of His moft Chriltiza, Majefity. Here is now apon the departure the Mary of Eowey with part of her Lading of Pilchards intending for Legorn.

Segnior Pallavicino's Daughermay in few days imbark in order to her voyage for Remt, all things being adjufted which nelate to her Mariage with the Popts Nephew, and 6 of this States Gallies appointed to ateend her thither, the Yopes being not yet refited afer theis return from the unfuccesful texpedition to Canjia.

Lecters of the 8 th indtant fiom Tunis informus of the arrival of she Centurioy, with another Fregat of Sir Tho. Allens \{quadron in that Bay, where they were civilly Treated by the Dey, who has dectared bis retolution of maintaining the peace with Ensland according to former Arricles, the people there detaring nothing more then to continue their Traffique and Commerce with the Englifh wichout interefting themfelves at all in the affairs of $A l g^{i e n}$.

They farther fay that the Dey had declared war ajainft the French, in profecuion nhereof a French Sailia was lately brought in th:re as prize, and the people on board made flaved, upon which the French Conful made his application to the Dey, but was teturned with a fhort antwer; That he thould if he pleafe, inform the King his Master that he would have no peace with bim.

From utilun we are advifed, that the 28 ct palt the Ecr clefiatical Cenfures were publifht according to the Popes Order againft Sagntor Pa:lo Zaccaria Provoft of the ColIegiate Church of Scalax for taking pofieffion for his Catholick Majefty (whore Collector he is) of the Goois and Eftates of the Religious looules lately fuppreffed: the Provalt has for his fecurie retired himfelf to the Cirtadell, where be intends aretrontinue till fone iflive can be put to this aftijir, which tis hoped may admir of a compor fure by the ondeavours of the Marquis Ifimbaldi, who has received a Commiflion for that purpofe.
We have here a confident report of a Treaty now on foot for a Marriage between the Duke of asantosa and a Daugbter to the decealed Duke Fisancis d' Efte, andethas feveral conferences had beea Ieli at Viadanis by the Marquis Canozta and the Catdinald' Effe upon this fublect, where alfo were made come propofals of another Mu** risge berween a fon of she Duke Francis and the Princels de Guafallie.

Fenice, Noty. 16. Notwithtanding the peace lirely made with the Cttoman Port ; we ate informed by a Caich from Zatas that the Turky cilher not knowing or prer tending not to have there recived due information of the Treaty, got together in a great body and made an incurerfion inte that Povinces but finding the Councrey in a pofture of defence, with our Mi iiia's in good readiness to oppafe themi were forced afier fome [mall rencounters and Joffes to return wirhour any confiderable boory, and that the Morlaichs had made a tetu-n of their vilits by a more effectual inroad intothe Otoman Terriotics, from whencezhey brought away mang Slaves and a boory of, an hundsed head of Caule, bue the Proveditor G.neral of the Province being informed of the diforders, had ordered immediate reftisution to be made of all that the Faid Morlachs had taken, and giving antritt Cha ge for the future prevention of farther excurfions, haxing alfo fent to make complains to the Turkifh Balia of the provecar rion given, and to re-sfablinh a mutual Amity and Commerceaccording to the intention of the la e peace.

Our Generalifimg Morofini is every where vifhing our Forks and Garilipns both in candia and the neighboring Iflands. Tbe Senate hath takrn all coovenient cara for the difpofal of thofe diftrefled Families which left tbeir Habitations in Candia upon its furrender, and bave or-
dered provifionto be made for their reception and mainrenance in the Towns of Pola and Paienzo in Iffria: the Archbishop of Candia being deprived of his charge, has u, on application to the Senate, ob:ained the Churchof st Gregary in this Cily, whele revenucs are to be affigned towards the fupport of his Diznity, and two of the Canons of the faid Church are difpached to Rome to proclure power from the Pope for the fertlement ther eof.
F.om the Levant weare told, that a Turkifh Corfair kad lacely fance the Treaty feifed on a Tartan a Chriftian Veflel, and carried her into Lepanto as prize, of which, complaint being made to the Baffa of thore parts, the Vef. fel and Goods were prefenely ordered so be reftored; bu: the Corfais difatisfi:d with the lofs of what he thought to have made his own, putoutagain to fea and Ceifed another Chriftian fhip which he carried away with bim for Barbary.

The Seate have larely ordered the difmiffion of fever tal hips which they had hired for their lerviee during tke war, and the unlading of Several others that were deGizned for candia.

Vienna, Nov. 8. The Fort neer Comorrs being by the Emperours permifion, flighted, that the Turks might not upon that account take an occafion to violate the Leagues we find thot that they are yet latisfed, but are like to infift with as mach eagernefs upon the demolifhing of our hew Fort of Leopoldfadt neer Neubauf $l$, to which the incereft of our Tertitories will not ealily permit as to comply.

Thefe and other confiderations oblige the Emparour to give our ftriat Orders for the reinforcement of all our frontier Garrifons, i being much feared lelt the Turkith foice b.ing diverred from the Venctians may fearch an emploiment to our difturbance; for which end Genezal Moxtecuculi is Speedily toretern into Hungary io give fuch Ordersas are neceffary for the furnihing our Magazincs, the ftrengthning of our Garrifons, and the compleating and reparation oi our fortifications; and fince we have had intelligence that Maravia was in danger .to be over-run by the Turk" the Regiment of Rabatta was ordered to march the the River Waag to appole them in their palfige, if they fheuld proceed in fuck a delign.

Th: 6,h inflant the Court appeared in extraoruinary. Guliantry, in Compliaient to his Catholick Majefty whole Birth-day it was.

We talk here of a great change of Officers in this Court, the Prince Labknopits to be declared Chief Minifter of Stgte; Count. Lambert to be promuted ta the Charge of Great Msitter of the Emperours Heulhold, his vacant Office of Great Chamberlain to be conferred upon the Mafter of the Horfe, he to be fucceeded by the Count d' Harach, and the Prince d' Averfferg to have the infpection of all the affairs of Austria, Stiria, Carinthit, and carniola, with fome other places.

The Iopes Nuncio has not altogether dicouraged the Emperour from folliciting the Pope for an equal fhare of his kindnels with the Crowns of Franie, Spain and Poland, in conferring a Cap at his Nomination upon the Prince de Baden Dourlac, of which the Emperour defires speedy fatisfaction, and the ad inftant difpatcht an Exprefs to Roinc to bnow the Popes final refolution in that paticular.

Bruffels, nov.26. The Conftable of cafille, being informed that the French forces are by Order from His $^{\text {Hen }}$ moft ChriAtian Mijefty drawing towards the fronciers ; and that more then ordinary care is lately taken to furnif the Mag zines io the new Conquefts with all forts of neceffaries for the war, has thought it fitalfo to take care for the reinforcing fuch of bis Garrifons as lie moft expofed to danger, and parcicularly has ordered two Tertias of Spanilh Foot oo march to Ipres, where the Cittadel is well advanced and near perfection; and on Sunday, laft one Regiment of 「oor marched to Falenciennes and ansther to cionde.

Yeflerday arrived Don Antonio de Cordoua, Iieure-nant-General of the Horfe, with a Lilt of fuch Regimenss and Companies as have been lately Reformed. The Deputies of Artois have made an agreement with Don Antonio Pimentel to cacertais 3 thoufsod Foor and 3 hurrdred Horfe.

Since the death of Dont Eeparndo Solis late Governour of the Caftle of Antwoerp Don Antonio Pimentel is for the prefent appointed to taks Ctarge of the Government.

The Bniverfity of Logivain baving been taxed by the Pope witha Breach of thrir Satutes, and confequently with the forfeiture of the Priviledges granted them by his Predeceffor Pope Paul V. inftanciog in many particulars in a Book printed for that purpofe; the Univerfing bave lately publifht their sanfwer by way of vindicationst which not Satisfying, the Popes Internuncio bas fummon'd them to appear by their Deputies in Rome before Chxiftimas, there to make their defence, or elfe to expeet Sentense, which the Unive fity refules, precending the mater on which the dipute is grounded, relates to the Ci vil powers and that they cannot make the appearance sequired without leave from His Catholick Majefty.

Hague, Nouemb. 29. On Wednelday latt the two Marfhalls of the Camp, Prince vaurice.y and the Heep Wurts went to the Affembly of the states of HoL land, where they had a long Conference about the raífing of the New Forces, which chey feem refolved to put into fpeedy execution. The Council of state theving given in their Judgments fur the neceffity of Raid fing of 14 thowfand Men, Vip. ten Regiments of Foor? and 4 of Hoffe; the report whereof has fil'ed this place with Officers, who come to offer their fervios to the stakes, who have already Publifht ehe Capitulation to te obferved by fuch of them as Thall be entertained in their fervice.
'Tris confidently faid, that his mof Chriftisn MajeAy lias demanded of the States Refticurion of all Eftates belonging to the Ecclefialticks within the Teritory of Hulf:

The states are now upon the Nomination of feveral Perfons to be fenci into England, France, Spais and Poland, under the character of Ambafiadors; we
 dayes to recturn Home.

Plymouth, Nev. 19. Yefterdsy and on Wednelday pur inso thisp Port 17 fail of hips, moft of thent Englifh front Burdeaiti, bound for London and others of our Porrs; the reft of them Dutoh and French fhips, all of them expeeting the opportunity of a fair wind to invite thent out to fea to compleat their royages.

Eime, Nevemb. 2r. Yefterday: arrived there the Francis of this place from Morlatix, telling us, That an Order has been Publickly Read in all the churebes and Publick places of that Town, ftrictly commanding all Seamen to make their Appearance, and to Enroll themfelves in His Majefties service, according to His Majoftics late Edict for that purpofe.

On Saturday laft was put in here by contrary Winies a fmall Fregar of Haver de grace.
