PRIVY COUNCIL OFFICE

At the Court at Buckingham Palace the 8th day of April 1960.

PRESENT,

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 18th day of March 1960, in the words and figures, following, that is to say:

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for altering the boundaries of the parishes of Saint John the Evangelist, Greengates; Holy Trinity, Idle; Saint John, Idle; Rawdon; Saint Cuthbert, Wrose; and Yeadon, all in the diocese of Bradford.

"SCHEME

"Whereas we are satisfied that it is desirable that the boundaries of the said parishes should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Donald, Bishop of Bradford, consents to the proposed arrangements (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme):

"Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of publication in the *London Gazette* of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the boundaries of the said parishes of Saint John the Evangelist, Greengates; Holy Trinity, Idle; Saint John, Idle; Rawdon; Saint Cuthbert, Wrose; and Yeadon shall be altered in the manner described in the Schedule hereto and delineated on the map annexed to this Scheme.

"THE SCHEDULE

"1. *The territory to be annexed to the parish of Saint Cuthbert, Wrose:*

"All that part (coloured purple on the map annexed hereto) of the parish of Saint John, Idle, which is bounded on the west partly by the parish of Holy Trinity, Idle, and partly by the parish of Saint Cuthbert, Wrose, and on the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundaries of the parishes of Saint Cuthbert, Wrose, Saint James, Bolton, and Saint John, Idle, all meet at the road junction known as Five Lane Ends and proceeding thence northeastwards to and along the middle of Bradford Road to a point opposite the middle of the northeastern end of the lane known as Doctor Hill, thence first southwestwards to then generally southwestwards along the middle of Doctor Hill and in a straight line in continuation thereof to a point in the middle of Highfield Road on the

boundary which divides the parish of Saint John, Idle, from the parish of Holy Trinity, Idle.

"2. *The territory to be annexed to the parish of Holy Trinity, Idle:*

"All that part (coloured green on the map annexed hereto) of the parish of Saint John, Idle, which is bounded on the northwest and west by the parish of Holy Trinity, Idle, on the south by the territory described in paragraph 1 of this Schedule and on the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at a point in the middle of Bradford Road opposite the middle of the northeastern end of the lane known as Doctor Hill and proceeding thence northeastwards along the middle of Bradford Road to a point opposite the middle of the southwestern end of Thorpe Garth, thence northeastwards to and along the middle of Thorpe Garth and in a straight line in continuation thereof to a point in the middle of Albion Road, thence eastwards along the middle of Albion Road, to a point opposite the middle of the southern end of Furlands road, thence northwards to and along the middle of Furlands Road to a point opposite the middle of the southeastern end of the footpath which leads northwestwards to Lilythorne Avenue and Croft Street, thence northwestwards to and along the middle of the said footpath to a point in the middle of its junction with a further footpath running northeastwards between the houses on the northwestern side of Albert Avenue and the houses on the southeastern side of Croft Street, thence first northeastwards then northwards along the middle of the last mentioned footpath and in a straight line in continuation thereof to a point in the middle of Apperley Road on the boundary which divides the parish of Saint John, Idle, from the parish of Holy Trinity, Idle.

"3. *The territory to be annexed to the parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Greengates:*

"(a) All that part (coloured brown on the map annexed hereto) of the parish of Saint John, Idle, which is bounded on the north by the parish of Holy Trinity, Idle, on the east and south by the parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Greengates, and on the remaining side by the territory described in paragraph 2 of this Schedule.

"(b) All that part (coloured red on the map annexed hereto) of the parish of Rawdon which lies to the southwest of the middle of the Leeds, Shipley and Bradford branch railway line of British Railways (London Midland Region).

"(c) All that part (coloured yellow on the map annexed hereto) of the parish of Yeadon which lies to the south of the middle of the Leeds, Shipley and Bradford branch railway line of British Railways (London Midland Region).

"(d) All that part (coloured blue on the map annexed hereto) of the parish of Holy Trinity, Idle, which lies to the south and east of an imaginary line
