

100 Officers; and among them two General Officers, with several other Persons of Note; and that they had taken 106 Colours and Standards, and 3½ Pieces of Cannon: That among other Officers who had been killed on the side of the Swedes, were reckoned, Colonel Lilliehok, and Lieutenant Colonel Cronhielm; That the Swedish Colonel Buchward, Major Vrangell, Major Snolski, and Major Chronstedt, had been dangerously wounded; but that the Number of Swedish Soldiers who had been killed was not considerable; and that General Reinschild himself had narrowly escaped, having had a Horse killed under him. This ill Success of the Saxons is said to have been owing in a great measure to their too great Confidence in their own Strength, and their want of good Intelligence, relying too much upon the false Accounts they had of the Force of the Enemy; of which, had they been rightly informed, they might have declined coming to an Engagement till such time as they had been joined by the King of Poland and General Braussen, who were marching to their Assistance, the former from Warfaw, and the other from Cracow, with considerable Reinforcements.

Francfort, Febr. 21. Monsieur Geldermalsen, Envoy from the States General, arrived here yesterday from Rastad, where he has been to confer with Prince Lewis of Baden. Our Forces about Fort Louis have reduced that Garrison to such Straights, that it has offered to capitulate; but the Conditions are not yet agreed upon. A Regiment of Foot of the Troops of Wolfenbuttle is come to Kuffstein, in its March towards Italy. Three Battalions of the Prussian Forces, which are also commanded thither, are advanced to the Frontiers of Tirol, where they are to continue a short time in Quarters of Refreshment: They have with them 600 Recruits for the Prussian Forces in Italy.

Hague, Febr. 16. N. S. Our Council of State has now under Consideration the naming of General Officers to command our Forces the next Campaign. Lieutenant-General Dopff arrived here two days ago from Mastricht. The Sieur Pathieco, Envoy of Portugal, had lately an Audience of the States General, to notify the Death of the late Queen Dowager of England. All continues very quiet on our Frontiers.

Falmouth, February 16. On the 12th Instant sailed hence Her Majesty's Ships the Vulture, Fox, and Guiseur, and under their Convoy 12 Sail of English and Dutch Merchant men bound for Ireland. The same Day sailed hence the Great Curteen, a Dutch Privateer, bound out a cruising. Yesterday came in here the Dolphin, of 26 Guns, a Privateer, belonging to Flushing, Captain Bouger Commander; and brought in a French Prize, called the Jealousy of Offend, of 24 Guns, in Ballast, bound for Nantz. This Prize made a good Resistance, in which the French Commander and 3 of his Men were killed.

Plymouth, February 17. On the 13th Instant several of Her Majesty's Ships came in here from the Eastward, with a considerable Fleet of Merchant-men and Transport-ships under their Convoy. The same Day came in the Modena Galley of Amsterdam, homeward-bound from Maderas; the Rose of Corke, homeward-bound from Rotterdam; the Richard and Margaret from Hambourg; the John from Rotterdam; and 3 Coasters from London, bound for this Place. This Day sailed to the Eastward Her Majesty's Ships the Sunderland and Rochester, with about 30 Sail of Merchant-men under their Convoy.

Bristol, Febr. 18. The 16th Instant came in here the Waterford Sloop from Waterford; the Patience from Dublin; and the St. John, John Elias Master, of and from Norway. The Arundel Man of War, with several Merchant-men under her Convoy, sailed hence the 14th, and most of them were put back by contrary Winds; but the Wind changing, they sailed again the next day. The 16th came in Her Majesty's Ships the Bridgewater and Shoreham from Cork, and under their Convoy the Don Carlos, Robert Summers Master, and the St. John Baptist, Anthony Brittlebolt Master, both from Jamaica, with several other Merchant-men from Ireland. Yesterday came in the Newnham from Dublin, and the Two Brothers of Glasgow from Londonderry. This day came in the William and the Salmon, both of and from Colrain.

Dartmouth, February 17. The 12th Instant came in here the Johnson Frigate from Jamaica, and another Ship from St. Christophers; a Dutch Hospital-ship from Barcelona; and the John and Margaret Pink from Virginia. The 13th the John Sloop of Lymrick sailed hence for Plymouth. The 15th Her Majesty's Ships the Exeter and Plymouth put into Torbay,

from whence they sailed last night for Plymouth, with about 10 Sail of Merchant-men and Transport-ships under their Convoy.

Tarmonth, Febr. 18. On the 16th Instant passed through our Roads several laden Colliers, bound to the Southward. Yesterday came in from the Southward Her Majesty's Ships the Rochester Prize and Postillion, with several Merchant-men under their Convoy, bound for Hull.
