### HONOURS AND AWARDS

#### CENTRAL CHANCERY OF THE ORDERS OF KNIGHTHOOD

St. James's Palace, London S.W.1.

13th May 1960.

The QUEEN has been graciously pleased to approve, on the advice of Her Majesty's Australian Ministers, the award of the British Empire Medal for Gallantry (Military Division) to:

2/771888 Private (temporary Corporal) Brian Phillip BENSON, Royal Australian Army Service Corps.

For courage and initiative in suppressing a petrol fire. Regardless of his personal safety he placed the nozzle of an extinguisher into a blazing drum of petrol and thereby quelled a dangerous outbreak.

Whereas the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 8th day of April 1960, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, and the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Tom, Bishop of Hereford (in witness whereof he has signed this Scheme), for effecting the union of the benefice of Coreley and the benefice of Doddington, both situate in the diocese of Hereford.

#### "SCHEME

"1. *Union of Benefices.* The benefice of Coreley and the benefice of Doddington shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Coreley with Doddington' but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

"2. *Taking effect of union.* Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the *London Gazette* the union shall forthwith take effect.

"3. *Parsonage House.* Without prejudice to the exercise before the date when the union takes effect of any of the powers conferred by the Parsonages

Measures, 1938 and 1947, upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Coreley shall, if at that date it so belongs to the said benefice, be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice.

"4. *Patronage.* After the union has taken effect the right of presentation to the united benefice shall be exercised by the patrons of the two benefices alternately, the patron of the benefice of Coreley having the first presentation to the united benefice to be made after the union."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 and 1930, and the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the *London Gazette*.
