Notice is hereby given in pursuance of section 85 (3) of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1950, that the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food and the Secretary of State for Scotland acting jointly have made the following Order:

An Order, dated 11th May, 1960, made under section 27 of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1950 (which enables the Minister and the Secretary of

State jointly to permit the landing of animals intended for exhibition) authorising the importation of one wildebeest and one giraffe, the property of the Dudley Zoological Society Limited, Dudley, Worcestershire, subject to specified conditions.
