The Hornchurch Urban District (St. George's Hospital) Public Path Diversion Order, 1960

GIPPING RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL

The Gipping Rural District Council (Parish of Hemingstone No. 1) Public Path Order, 1960

Notice is hereby given that on the 13th day of May 1960, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed the above Order.

Its effect is to divert part of the public right of way which runs in a general north-westerly direction from Church Lane across O.S. No. 20 at Hemingstone Hall, Hemingstone, to a line running first in a general northerly direction across O.S. No. 20 and then in a general westerly direction across O.S. No. 20 and 10. The length of the part of the existing right of way to be extinguished is 170 yards and the length of the new right of way to be created is 196 yards. The part of the existing right of way to be extinguished will be closed from 10th June 1960.

The Order becomes operative as from the 24th day of May 1960, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act, 1959, or on the grounds that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order he may, within six weeks of the date of publication of this notice, make application to the High Court.
